Brief Overview

This summer we are offering positions to young people (ages 18 – 30) who are post-secondary students or recently graduated from secondary/post-secondary education that are actively involved in social justice based conversations that they are facing in their community and in the world around them (such as: anti-racism, environmental, queer issues, harm reduction, Indigenous, mental health, public health, housing, and spirituality). This summer will focus on the desire for community and connection in this virtual time, while we share in building a community of love and service with one another.

Duties

- Engaging through Social Media platforms (Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, TikTok, etc..) with youth and young adults throughout the region on the social justice topic that is particularly of interest.
- Supporting Communities of Faith (congregations and community ministries) that are interested in engaging young people in conversations.
- Resource Development, developing resources that will assist communities of faith in engaging international learning around social justice opportunities.
- Hosting Conversations/Events around the specific topics of interest that would allow for intergenerational relationship building.
- Facilitation of conversations that may occur online with youth and young adults throughout the regional council.

Skills Required

- Experience with and a passion for the social justice topic that you will be engaged.
- Self-Starter, ability to work remotely and utilize technology.
- Teamwork, ability to work within a team framework across the Canadian Shield/Shining Waters Regional Councils.
- Creative, utilizing your creative energies in online spaces. Visual and performing arts experience is an asset.

- Communication, ability to host conversations, communicate with guest speakers, and communities of faith.
- Writing/Reading, ability to create resources for communities of faith in regards to your topic of interest.
- Leadership, a desire to help others grow in communal engagement and possibility.
