





1. Opening:

- a. Welcome: Bill Steadman welcomed all to this the second meeting of the Commission. The first was a brief meeting on June 1st as part of the Regional Council meeting.
- b. Members of the Commission did a check in then Bill opened with prayer

2. Review of Support to Communities of Faith Commission (SCoFC) Responsibilities.

- a. The Governance Document (Appendix A) was reviewed. Our responsibility is to track action under our Mandate and the challenge is to be mindful of the weight of our decision-making. Christina Stricker has been asked to discuss with the Nominations Committee of the Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive the length of terms of the commissioners and succession planning. In the first few years, staggered terms would provide continuity.
 - i. Covenanting with Communities of Faith: What will this look like? David Allen from General Council has made a template for this and the staff are willing to do the work on this with the help of Peter, Mardi, George and Marilyn from the Commission (as needed) and then pilot this in a few Communities of Faith. There was a consensus that the staff will carry this work with an openness to link with members of this commission,
 - ii. **Support for Communities of Faith** we will need specifics and some of this will be come clearer as we face specific issues and concerns (such as Trinity UC North Bay letter later.)
 - iii. Leadership training
 - iv. Worship resources for lay lead Communities of Faith.
 - v. **Self Assessment reviews** this is work to do.
 - vi. **Resource Teams**: Support and track work of the Property Resource team, Mission Support and Regional Council Grants team, Right Relations Resource team, Affirming Ministry Resource team and Youth & Young Adult Ministry Resource team. The Commission needs to establish process, policy and how we approve their work.
- b. Policy Development: As a body we need to be clear of the policies developed by the Resource teams, we need to review and approve these policies and determine the level of autonomous decisions that can be made. It is not productive to re-do all the work of these teams for every decision. The Grants team is in the discovery phase of their work and are using the processes set out by the General Council with some adaptations in the document we received.

3. Resource Team Updates

a. Property Resource team

b. Mission Support & Regional Council Grant Team. The criteria (appendix B) was received. This will help to guide the decision process with clear communication and consistency. A question was asked about #4 "must be with paid accountable ministry"; Melody clarified that there were other grants for low income Communities of Faith to help with capital projects, technology etc. Melody also clarified that #9 is an accountability piece that will help her track the grants as direct deposit is now the preferred method of payment.

The team has also approved a request from the Thunder Bay Communities of Faith to carry out the Kairos Blanket Exercise in the future.
- d. Affirming Ministry Resource Team. Will Kunder is the staff support. Peter Haddow reported that this team is working on the status with Affirm United. Rob Smith attended the Affirm United Conference in Calgary and noted that there was a proposal for a significant increase in the annual dues for both Communities of Faith (from \$100.00 to \$500.00) and for Regional Councils. There was a consensus within the Commission that our concern over the increase in the dues needs to be communicated. This concern needs to go to the Regional Council Executive.
- e. Youth and Young Adult Ministry Resource Team (YAYA). Melody Duncanson Hales is the staff support. This team met over the summer. The fall activities are numerous with a Cambrian Youth Network constituting a network, choosing to formalize with the election a chair and making a motion to look into Affirming ministry. Using a seed grant from Cambrian Presbytery, this group is in the process of meeting several times. There is a bus going to the Niagara Youth Festival, Sudbury youth have started a "sub-hub" and are meeting regularly. The YAYA team also sees a need for more face to face leadership development.

4. Emergent Business:

a. Little Current P.C. As part of the Re-think Green program, Little Current has had an energy assessment and made application to the Mission Support & Regional Council Grant Team for a Church Modernization and Improvement Grant to replace the windows. The team reviewed the request and recommended approval. This is an example of work that needs to be approved at the team level and sent to the Commission for information.

That the SCoFC approve the grant request from Little Current for the amount of \$5,000.00 towards window replacement. **Carried** (without opposition)





At least one more application (now overdue) from St. Matthew's St. Paul's Anglican United Church in Hearst is expected. Regional staff are doing some preliminary work on what grants and budget items will be available for 2020, and the Grants Team will be presenting recommendations to SCoF for Regional grants..

- ❖ Affirming Ministry Resource Team: This team has yet to met. Clarification that Christina will take to the Executive of the Canadian Shield Regional Council, our concern about the large increase in fess from Affirming United. Will Kunder, Peter Haddow and Christina Stricker, will draft a letter to be sent from our commission to the Executive. The priority of this team is to work on the Affirming United designation for the Canadian Shield Regional Council.
- ❖ Youth And Young Adult Ministry Resource Team (YAYA): The Youth and Young Adults Team will be meeting in early November, once we are back from the Niagara Youth Festival, to consider comprehensive strategy for 2020, especially in light of the National Rendezvous event in August 2020, and to consider educational support to youth ministry volunteers. Report to Support to Communities of Faith Commission

ZOOM Meeting – Wednesday, October 23, 2019, 7:00p

Submitted by George and Joy Bott for St. John's United Church/Canadian Shield Region of United Church of Canada (UCCan) United-in-Worship Project

At the spring meeting of the Canadian Shield Region in Sault Ste. Marie, I was to have presented a report to this Commission to request support for this project. I was unable to extricate myself from the workshop I was in to participate with you in that meeting and begin a discussion. Thus, today's report.

Where are we right now?

- In 2019, St. John's received a growth grant of \$25000 to be used, in part, to get the United-in-Worship Project started.
- There are currently 85 individuals, associated with UCCan communities of faith, with access to the weekly resources of the United-in-Worship Project.
- There is a total of 18 liturgical writers who have, to date, supplied worship resources to the United-in-Worship Project. Many have provided liturgy multiple times. The support comes from individuals from 5 UCCan Regions between Canadian Shield Region and the Canadian east coast. Our thanks to Will Kunder for setting this in motion. Most of the contributions have come from within the Canadian Shield Region and St. John's UCCan, Marathon. The writers produce weekly, an Order of Service and a Sermon/Reflection text on a focus Scripture from the Common Lectionary or produce an off-lectionary liturgy and sermon text. In some cases, the writer provides a video version of their message/reflection/sermon or invites St. John's (United-in-Worship Project) to create the video version. We now do remote recording along with postproduction and a digital presentation of the order of service.
- We are still using Dropbox for delivery of the resources but are finding it is becoming unwieldy with no analytics to provide feedback on who is using what elements of the resources posted. To respond to these problems, St. John's has commissioned the development of a Web Site to house the project and its resources. The website will become active for the beginning of Advent 2019 and will have an annual subscription fee equal to the cost of 1 pulpit supply (as set out by the UCCan). Subscribers will have access to 52 weeks of worship resources. Money raised will go toward supporting the project so that it becomes self-sustaining and pay for: Web site development and maintenance costs; rentals of server space; fees for service to YouTube, Vimeo; Database management for subscriptions and invoicing; software subscriptions (Office 365, Snagit, ...)

We see a need for 6 members on a team that can provide support for the weekly and on-going activities and to act as a Board to provide direction as this grows and becomes self-sustaining.







APPENDIX D GC44 Proposal

Proposal Concerning Faithful Ministry Personnel

Preamble:

Huron Shores United Church is responding to the closed settlement of 2018 between Reverend Gretta Vosper and Toronto Conference and its impact on The United Church of Canada

We are concerned that this action has cast a shadow, and raised questions for our wider church, especially relating to the faith of actively serving Ministry Personnel.

Our Council heard the concerns of some members of our congregation and our community. These were referred to a working group to create this proposal, supported by our congregation, community and Council.

This proposal includes our requested course of action by the United Church of Canada in a deliberate and transparent manner.

What is this issue?

- A lack of transparency in the settlement process raises questions which extend beyond one individual.
- b. The settlement may have resolved one situation, but leaves the wider question unaddressed: Uncertainty now as to whether Ministry Personnel in the United Church of Canada have a living faith in God.

Why is this issue important?

- a. The settlement has raised the question that some ministry personnel have left their faith, but are not being open about it, leading to a lack of confidence in public proclamation and testimony.
- b. The wide publicity around the settlement has been framed as an unstated position of the United Church of Canada, which appears to permit "atheist clergy."
- c. Partner churches within the World Council of Churches, and other ecumenical bodies need assurance that the United Church of Canada has faith in God, honours scripture, and properly administers the sacraments.

How might Council respond to this issue?

 a. HSUC Council accept the following proposal and transmit it to WOW Regional Council with concurrence:

HSUC Council proposes that General Council clarify expectations regarding the faith of Ministry Personnel, and develop procedures to provide a mechanism to review the faith of Ministry Personnel.





Decisions of the Property Resource Team

July 11, 2019

We decided that Gordon Roberts would serve as chairperson and Janet Ross would be the secretary.

October 9, 2019

Recommendations:

a) Manses can be sold and the dollars invested with the interest used for ongoing housing allowance.

<u>Discussion</u>: Some churches have full-time ministers and may require more funding for ongoing housing allowance than the interest covers.

b) The church can bring a request for an increase back to The Properties Resource Team if they want to dip into the principal. The Properties Resource Team will handle anything further on a case by case basis.

Harmony – Thunder Bay

Recommendations:

Policy (Selling Excess Property) – The members of the church will forward to the Properties Resource Team the minutes of the meeting, once the church members have made their decision, and ask for permission. - It was suggested that a point person from the PRT be appointed to deal with Harmony directly. Paul McAlister was appointed.

A question on what happens to the funding was asked, and the suggestion that the church members give the PRT a report on what is planned for the funds was made. It was

proposed that the funding should go to the new church to help them continue the work of the church.

November 15, 2019

St. Andrews – North Bay

St Andrews in North Bay has issues with their Belfry. They have closed off the balcony for safety concerns, since the church is liable. We can send a letter to their secretary to remind them of the process and that we are here for them to help with the process of repairs.

Motion: that Rob sends them a letter as soon as possible and as directly as possible that includes what the PRT processes are, the needs and support. Approved.

Discussion on Approval Process

If over so many \$\$ to fix, they need to get permission from the Property Resource Team and Rob needs to be informed. Proposed for cases of property matters where document sign off of Community Support Minister is required, therefore signed by Rob. With information, is this a matter for Regional Council, or the Staff person? Will Rob have approval for under \$75,000 worth of work? There are 3 Congregational Support Ministers, who, or do all have approval privileges? Or is the process to just let support know, but not go as far as approval? If it is to just let Rob (Property team) know, then why do they need to?

Suggestion: All renovations over \$75,000 dollars, all selling of church property and all purchasing of church property must be reviewed by the Property Resource Team and its staff lead and approved by Support to Communities of Faith Commission.

January 16, 2020

Grace – Sudbury Motion: Moved by Jim Jackson and seconded by Jack Page, that the PRT support and recommend to the SCoF Commission the rebuilding of Grace United in Sudbury as per the presentation made to us this afternoon by Melody Duncanson Hale. The motion was Approved.

Harmony – Thunder Bay

Motion: Moved by Jim Jackson, Seconded by Jack Page, that Rob Smith on behalf of the PRT, responds to the congregation in a letter and lets them know what is required.

Trinity – North Bay

Trinity: North Bay is asking for permission from the PRT to recommend to the SCoF Commission that they use their Manse funding of \$60,000 on their building project loans. The members of their congregation will help with raising funds to pay it back. The final costs for the repairs was closer to \$300,000.

Re: 2020 Membership Fees

Dear Michiko,

I am writing in my capacity as staff support to both the Affirming Ministry resource team and the Support to Communities of Faith Commission of the Canadian Shield Regional Council.

At the November 28, 2019 meeting of our Commission, it was determined that we write to Affirm United to get clarification about what we have learned would be a significant increase in membership fees for 2020. Representatives to last summer's AGM returned with notice that a large increase could be expected for the coming year.

Before I was able to send that correspondence, we received the notice from Affirm about the changes to membership fees. While we appreciate the information provided, our Regional Council remains deeply concerned about the process by which this decision was made. Our delegates report that they felt the decision about this was rushed through without adequate time to fully discuss the likely ramifications of such a dramatic financial change.

For such a direction to be taken, we would have expected an opportunity for discussion and feedback from the full constituency. We wonder, for example, if Affirm is even aware of what the actual impact of this increase will mean for communities of faith? While you have placed a cap at \$500, do you know how many congregations might actually face a 500% increase? A the time of writing we have no idea what the increase will be to our affirming congregations.

The increase for our regional council, from \$100 to \$1000, is felt to be totally unreasonable.

Equally concerning, is that this is the 2nd year in a row where the AGM has made profound changes to the affirming requirements with no consideration of a "notice of motion" or opportunity for consultation. To have left such decisions to the AGM alone – where many delegates are first time members – feels like poor governance.

We have expressed, already, our dissatisfaction with the procedures which were determined for affirming designation in the new Regional Council structure.

That decision along with this one, re: assessments, have done more to undermine Affirming ministry in our area than support.

I can report that our regional council will be looking to determine whether or not funding of \$1000 will be something we can manage in 2020.

We request that this concern be shared at the next meeting of your Executive and ask for response to the concerns expressed in this letter.

While I can't speculate on what the Canadian Shield Region might do with the assessment decision, I do expect that we will likely bring a proposal to the 2020 AGM to curtail such affirming direction changes without substantially greater consultation.

Background to the AUSE membership increase, 2020

Current Context

The Affirming Ministry Program is a central part of who AUSE is and what it does. And it's blossoming. In 2017 we set a new record when 35 ministries became Affirming in that year; 2019 will see very similar numbers. At the end of 2015, we had 95 ministries in the Affirming process. As of our July 2019 AGM, we had 150. We want that number to grow. At this time, less than ten percent of all ministries in the United Church are Affirming, but every new ministry makes a positive difference, and a positive difference is our focus.



These numbers are amazing. In fact, they were unthinkable only ten years ago. And this also creates growing pains. We are still a volunteer-led movement, and face the same dilemmas of a shrinking and overly busy volunteer base as the rest of the church. Each ministry in the process is accompanied by a volunteer throughout its journey. When needed and asked, AUSE will find volunteers to help with questions, conflicts, resourcing, and pastoral care. As the numbers in the process grow, the volunteers at the heart of the process are carrying more and more work. At the same time, the demand for timely and professional communication is growing. We need to plan on hiring additional support staff to help with the workload and expansion of the Affirming Ministry Program.

It may look like the numbers of new ministries should cover growing costs. And they do help. But as one example, our record year in 2017 created \$3500 in additional revenue. That isn't enough to allow us to commit to even a half time staff position.

If we don't raise membership fees significantly, we will eventually deplete our existing reserves because we have a small deficit each year in supporting a part-time essential communications resource. We express deep gratitude to both members and donors, who have helped us increase capacity over the past five years. But as growth becomes more sustained, it's clear that existing resources cannot meet capacity needs.

How the membership fee increase works:

The 2019 AGM approved changes to increase the membership fees as follows:

- that community of faith (congregational) membership fees for Affirming Ministries be 1/20 of 1% of net revenue, to a maximum of \$500 and a minimum of \$100. Net revenue is the basis on which the United Church bases its congregational assessments. This figure is submitted on the Statistics form each year. For budgeting purposes, Ministry Treasurers will have a password to access this figure from the United Church website. Affirming Ministries and members will be invoiced by Affirm United in the spring of each year.
- that regional council membership fees be \$1,000
- that non-congregational ministries which are Affirming pay what they can between \$100 (the former flat membership fee) and \$500

 that individual/household membership fees increase to \$50 (while retaining the option of a reduced or free membership fee if need is indicated.)

While understanding that this decision may cause concern, AUSE feels that the new membership fees for communities of faith, based on this formula, will be more equitable. We know many ministries have very constrained budgets. Below we explain more about what your membership fees have been supporting, and offer some more information on what increased fees would support.

A ten hour per week Communications Coordinator: our single biggest expense. This has made a significant difference to the quality and diversity of our communications and is the reason for the significant growth in the Affirming Ministries Program. The job: To promote the Affirming Ministries Program and improve AUSE's external communications and engagement through channels like a regular newsletter, new resources, a website and social media that are frequently updated; provide prompt and helpful responses to some of the many emails we receive; support our very busy Affirming Ministry Coordinators; support Affirming Ministries and those in the process by finding them supports; and provide support to our annual conference and other key events.

PIE Day 2019 (and 2020): www.pieday.ca This first-time project was designed to give everyone a chance to have fun, eat dessert, and talk about how we be PIE: Public, Intentional, and Explicit in our radical hospitality, especially for LGBTQIA+ and Two Spirit people. In particular, this project was designed to resource ministries who are already Affirming, and may be struggling to keep that commitment fresh and active. Thanks to a Gifts with Vision grant, we had the funds to cover the video that accompanied PIE Day. But everything else about this national project is supported by your memberships and donations.

One "in-person" Council meeting per year: Council members gather once a year in February from across the country with all expenses paid. This is important to our work and cohesion, but this also means Council members have been paying out of pocket to attend the year's second meeting at the summer conference. Council also meets for four 2 hour meetings via conference call each year.

Website: <u>www.ause.ca</u> maintenance, security, hosting, and other fees: all the hidden costs that accompany communication.

What your increased membership fees will allow us to do over time:

At the 2020 annual conference we hope to engage in visioning that would allow a much more complete route forward. For now, these are elements that Council has begun to discuss

Hire a full time staff person, eventually

Provide honoraria for Affirming Ministry Coordinators, who are currently volunteers and carry the vast majority of the Affirming program work.

Offer much more *support to already-Affirming ministries*. For example, PIE Day 2020 (Saturday 14 March 2020) is one small element, as are continued website development, regular communications, an active social media presence and group forum, and more.

Support our *annual conference*: continue to build on expanding numbers, making the space as diverse, equitable, and accessible as possible.

Provide for two Council meetings annually with expenses covered for all Council members.





Acknowledgement of Territory and Safe Space: Bill Steadman acknowledged the diverse territories that we are all on. Each member present named the Treaty in which they were located. Bill also declared that the United Church of Canada ensures a respectful attitude and that we commit to be dutiful to the task at hand and accountable to each other. Approval of Agenda: The agenda was approved by consensus with the addition of an update on the Conversations in North

Business Arising:

- 1. Covenanting process: Rob Smith reported that he has a template and work-shopped it with 4 out of the 7 Communities of Faith in the Thunder Bay area. The Pinegrove Pastoral Charge will try it out. The purpose is to promote discussion and visioning rather than just being a formality. Melody shared with the group a template for the Self Assessment that needs to be done by each Community of Faith. Several suggestions included the addition of a piece about reconciliation, including a place for the independent annual review of the financial statement, a question about the need for the section on the Privacy Policy and under the Record keeping section it should be annually. The staff will continue to work on this and then move to field testing. The hope is that both the Covenanting process and the self-assessment form will be ready for the June annual meeting of the Canadian Shield Regional Council.
- 2. North Bay Consultation: The second gathering was held on February 26, 2020. At this meeting which included the North Bay churches as well as Sturgeon Falls, the group committed to meeting on a regular basis. The consensus of the group was that they would like to plan more joint activities. A handful, but not the majority, sees this as an opportunity to discuss closures and amalgamations. The energy and priorities is to get to know each other and to get out of their silos. The group looked at opportunities for partnerships, worshiping together, a communication strategy and city wide services and a focus on Holy Week. The homework from this meeting was to have a discussion with the congregation or governing body. The next meeting is April 1, 2020.
- 3. Grace United Church Update: The Annual meeting was held and they are on track towards reconstruction.

Report from Canadian Shield Regional Council Representative: Christina Stricker reported that she will send an e-mail to President Kathy Smith to ask what to do with the Annual Reports from the Communities of Faith be added to the next meeting's agenda. Presently Communities of Faith are encouraged to send a digital copy to the office.

Jim Jackson, past chair, is head of the nominations for the Regional Council. He is looking to talk to all the team members and commission members about their intentions on continuing service.

Resource Team Updates:

- <u>Property Resource Team</u> A long conversation about the renovations under \$75,000.00 continues with this team. No conclusion has been reached. Schreiber had it's annual meeting but no decision was made about closure.

- Mission Support & Regional Council Grants Resource Team: No meeting was held this month. The intent is to meet on the second Friday of the month. A request from the North Bay Mission cluster about budgets for clusters. A verbal request from Copper Cliff United Church about their remaining St Paul's mission support grant should go to the Finance committee of the Region.
- Right Relations Resource Team: An upcoming meeting will be held this Friday with a face to face meeting April 17, 2020. Lisa Blais has agreed to take the lead for this team. A day long workshop is planned together with MILC on April 18, 2020. The team is also working on a plan for the Sacred Fire for the Annual meeting of the Canadian Shield Regional Council. The team is also following closely the issues currently involving the Wet'suweten elders.
- Affirming Ministry Resource Team: Peter Haddow has agreed to take the leadership of this team. The team met this past week. The team is meeting with Linda Hutchison from Affirm United on March 10th to see what needs to be done for official status for our Region. The team is hoping to have something out to all Communities of Faith in time for P.I.E day. There is space on the website for the team to use and they will want to consider input to the website. There has been no response from the letter (January 23, 2020 minutes appendix B) sent to Affirm United about the annual fee increase.
- Youth & Young Adult Ministry Resource Team: This team meets the first of the month. A consistent chair has not materialized so a rotating chair system is in place. The Youth Regional gathering is set for May 15, 16, 17, 2020 with the Senior Youth gathering at Trinity Lively and the Junior group at St Andrew's, Larch St, Sudbury. Plans for participation at Rendez-vous Aug. 11 14, 2020 are challenged by the cost of transportation. The Canadian Shield Regional Executive will be approached to support a travel pool of funds. George Bott suggested a canvas of the region for excess travel points that might help.
 - Camping Ministry and Camp McDougal has planning going on . Nancy Ferguson will be on site at Camp McDougal for 7 of the 8 weeks as head chaplain. Lay leaders, ministry personnel are encouraged to come and see for a few days what this is all about. There is a fund raising dinner for Camp McDougal March 1, 2020 in Sault Ste. Marie.
 - Training for Youth Leadership is being planned with 2 sessions, one in May and another in October
- <u>United in Worship Project:</u> The project is going well. Presently the financial process is being set up and they are now receiving payment for subscriptions. A road trip is planned along Highway 11 to promote the project and the portable hub will be demonstrated. The project had previously received financial help of up to \$5000.00 to set up the website and there are funds remaining. George Boot requested that some of that remaining allocation be used for mileage and food for this road trip.

That our Commission approve the re-allocation of the 2019 Worship project grant for the expenses related to the promotion of the United in Worship. Carried with George Bott abstaining.

The project leaders including Randy, have been meeting with the other regions to set up hubs and satellites. EDGE and the General Council Executive are also involved.


Emergent Business:

Executive and Staff members shared what is going on in their communities, including churches that have already decided to close their doors to Sunday Services.


Melody indicated that the youth event planned for May 2020 has now been cancelled and will have further discussions with the Youth and Young Adult Ministries Resource Team about another possible date.

Kathie Smith welcomed everyone to the meeting of Executive. The CSRC Staff joined Executive for this meeting.

Kathie honoured the traditional lands upon which we meet with the following words:

"The lands where we gather today have been places of gathering for First Nations people as they camped and travelled across the land for generations beyond our knowing. Before people arrived from across the seas, these Nations lived, loved, raised children and made a living. They lived in harmony with all that the Creator had made. As we gather today, we recognize those traditional sojourners in this land. We give thanks for them and for the lands on which we meet. We acknowledge that our history has come at a great cost to the aboriginal community and we commit ourselves to be partners in healing and reconciliation with understanding and intention." Kathie then read the CSRC safe space statement:

Staff are working from home and the CSRC offices are closed (except when only one person is going in).

Maxine shared some questions that the Worship and Music Planning Team had. It was decided that the 2020 RC Meeting Planning Team and Worship Team would answer those questions at their meeting on April 1st, 2020 before the Executive meeting.

Chair of Planning Team Check-in

Barb reported that a decision about postponing the 2020 RC Meeting has not been made yet. One idea was to wait until the end of April to make the decision. Executive and Staff had a fulsome discussion.

Peter stated that unlike other Regional Councils, we are not in the position that we will lose money (deposits, etc.) if we do not cancel now. Our situation is different in that Barb believes that the hotels, caterer, St. Andrew's UC, and Pete's Rental will not have a problem deferring. She will report back to the April 1, 2020 Executive meeting with more details. Peter indicated that if the decision needed to be made today, he would have no problem postponing.

Barb stated that if we were to postpone until the fall, the meeting might happen on the last weekend of September or the first weekend of October before Thanksgiving. Peter cautioned that we have some staff overlap with the Shining Waters Regional Council and their meeting is being held on the weekend of October 16th, 2020. There will need to be at least a two-week stretch between the two meetings.

Peter asked staff to give their input regarding postponing the meeting. Will put the idea forth of cancelling the 2020 RC Meeting entirely and having it next year at this time. He suggested that we take the money budgeted for the meeting and use it for emergency funding for communities of faith.

Melody felt that since advertising has not gone out for the youth event in Sudbury on the May long weekend, there is no immediate need to cancel anything. She will keep Executive updated.

Lillian indicated that Mardi Tindal was coming as the guest speaker to the MP Retreat before the RC Meeting in Sudbury. She has booked her flight already but Lillian feels it won't cost much to change the flight to a new date. Mardi will let Lillian know if she is available in late September/early October. Lillian will be retired at that point but is willing to come back and host the retreat in the fall if needed.

There was consensus that the CSRC Executive approve of a hiring team consisting of Peter Hartmans, Will Kunder, and Jim Jackson, giving Peter permission to recruit 2 more team members that are Ministry Personnel (possibly female for gender balance).

Development of Restricted Funds Criteria and Policy

Our current working document is attached. These fund criteria and policies are being considered at each meeting. The following three proposals are our first recommendations.

1.Camping Ministry Fund –

Individual Bursary: ½ costs up to \$400; staff to approve and report (up to a total limit of \$7500/year). Must be to an accredited United Church camp.

Communities of Faith Grant: ½ costs up to \$2500/year.

Special requests from Regional camps will be reviewed by Grants Team, approved by the support to Communities of Faith Commission or Regional Executive.

2.Youth Fund -

Individual Bursary: Individual bursary 1/3 costs up to \$500 for youth + leaders; staff to approve and report on requests up to \$150 (up to a total limit of \$4000 in a non-Rendezvous year; in a Rendezvous year, additional funds will be made available.) Communities of Faith Grant up to \$1000/ every two years; partnerships are encouraged between communities of faith.

3.Cluster and Network Fund -

Project Grant up to \$2000/year. Purpose of grant is to invest in networks and clusters as they form, to encourage collaborative ministry. Criteria to be reviewed each year.

United in Worship Project: The website is up and running, and the subscribers are increasing. There are added support resources for use for free on the site as well. The planned road trip to promote United in Worship across the Highway 11 corridor has been put on hold.

We are still in the early stages of development of policy under this new governance structure. Still working on developing clusters and networks. Oversight has been sent back to the Communities of Faith and once the self-assessment template is done it will be a way to monitor the progress and health of a Community of Faith.

Communities of Faith without Paid Accountable Ministry must connect with their supervisors or the Pastoral Relations Commission.


APPENDIX 1

Regional Approval for Temporary Amendment of Bylaws for Pastoral Relations

GS 49 TEMPORARY AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS RE: PASTORAL RELATIONS as approved the General Council Executive indicate that to utilize the measures the community of faith must have the approval of the Regional Council. The Canadian Shield Regional Council Pastoral Relations Commission that has oversight and decision-making responsibility for pastoral

relations matters has considered what this approval process with look like in our regional council, with the intent of being able to respond and consider to approval in a very timely manner.

- 1. If the pastoral relation action to be considered is the result of a search process for which a Liaison has been appointed by the regional council, the community of faith will work with the Liaison to bring the request to the Pastoral Relations Commission through the Pastoral Relations Minister or the Chair of the Pastoral Relations Commission. The Liaison must be available to participate in the meeting of the governing body making the decision. The Pastoral Relations Commission upon receipt of the request to function under the temporary amendment will meet in as is possible through a video conference meeting and consider the request and inform the community of faith of its decision.
- 2. If the pastoral relations action is the re-appointment of currently serving staff, contact the Pastoral Relations Minister or the Chair of the Pastoral Relations Commission. If there is NO change in the terms of the appointment (that is the same number of hours) from the last appointment period, the Pastoral Relations Minister and Chair of Pastoral Relations will be decided whether to confer approval or hold a meeting of the Pastoral Relations Commission to do so. If there is a change in the terms (number of hours), the Pastoral Relations Minister and chair of the Pastoral Relations Commission will in the first instance consult with the ministry personnel to be reappointed to see if they are in agreement, before taking the request to the Pastoral Relations Commission.
- 3. If the pastoral relations action is about a **change in pastoral relations to be initiated by the pastoral charge,** contact the Pastoral Relations Minister (Rev. Lillian Roberts until June 5, 2020); June 6 July 31, 2020 consult the Executive Minister Rev. Peter Hartmans or his designate. In this instance, the serving ministry personnel must be consulted and aware of their voice in the process before the pastoral relations commission will consider approval. A member of the pastoral relations commission or the pastoral relations minister will participate in the governing body meeting.

That the Canadian Shield Regional Council (CSRC) Executive approve that the CSRC partner with the United Way Centraide North Eastern Ontario to receive funds to help seniors in North Eastern Ontario during the COVID-19 pandemic.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Through financial assistance from the federal government's *New Horizons* program, money has been allocated to help seniors during the COVID-19 pandemic. The money has been distributed to United Ways across the country. The United Way Centraide North Eastern Ontario has received funds to help our seniors in North Eastern Ontario.

We already know that Lions Clubs as well as our own churches are already assisting seniors by picking up groceries and prescriptions. In some cases, they are helping our vulnerable seniors by purchasing groceries for them. Some groups are making and delivering meals to their older adults that are in need. This is such a fantastic initiative especially in our rural areas.

There are two different groups that we can approach. Lions Clubs do not have a charitable status number. United Way would like to partner with the Canadian Shield Regional Council to enable this work because they have charitable status and they are able to be funded for this purpose. The CSRC would only distribute funds for the amount that was approved by the United Way. You could request an amount between \$1,000 - \$4000 to cover such things as: food baskets, gift cards, mileage costs for delivery, etc. Lions Clubs are asked to complete the application listing the Canadian Shield Regional Council as the Organization Name so that the United Way is legally able to disburse funds.

The second group is our own churches who can apply for funding to help with the work they are already doing in their communities.

There is a very short timeline to access these funds - applications should be received before May 13. Applications will be for the New Horizons Seniors Program funding.



Step Two:

Designated Categories:

Call for distinct nomination for each specified category of commissioner, those not elected in the specified category automatically are added to the general pool of nominees.

Nominations will be through the website portal for nominations. Nominations process will be open for both self-nomination and nomination by a mover and seconder. Nominations MUST be accompanied by a written submission of one page by nominee including a photograph. These will be posted on the portal, as nominations are received. Nominations with their written submission will be available to the regional council representatives 1 week before the electronic meeting.

Nominations will close upon an announced date and notice of closure will be posted on the website nominations portal.

Voting Process:

Executive will confirm the chair of the regional council as elected and the Executive will elect the persons to the designated categories – indigenous, racialized and youth.

The ballot for the virtual meeting will then be prepared following the Executive's action.

Electronic voting will take place during the electronic regional council meeting with provision that voting is by confidential ballot.

Alternates if required, will be appointed by the Executive Minister from those nominated but not elected on the ballot.



PRESENTATION OF AFFIRM RESOURCE TEAM'S QUESTIONS

Will highlighted the Affirm United/S'affirmer Ensemble (AUSE) process for regional councils to become Affirming. Regardless of whether a presbytery or conference was already Affirming, AUSE has indicated that all regional councils are a new entity and therefore must enter into a new process for becoming Affirming.

Will shared the Affirming Resource Team's questions that all working groups within the CSRC must consider:

- 5. As the Canadian Shield Regional Council works toward our Affirming Ministry designation, how is your area of the region's governance structure living out our affirming commitment within its responsibility and function?
- 6. What might we be doing to demonstrate our commitment to the affirming process in the year ahead?

Executive then had an extensive discussion about the questions and offered feedback:

- The CSRC Executive (and the full RC meetings) always makes a safe space statement at the beginning of its meetings;
- Repeating the safe space statement becomes ingrained after hearing it over and over again until it becomes routine – there should be a RC policy that says all meetings must read it:
- As Executive reviews the Governance Document, it would be helpful to change each working groups to reflect the requirement to have their own safe space statement read at each meeting – make it mandatory;
- The CSRC created a team (Affirming RT) that is directly accountable to Executive;
- The Nominations Committee worked hard at finding a way towards a fair nominations process;
- What does the safe space statement actually mean? Need some education around it;
- Is there a possibility of working with the Affirming RT/AUSE to create an easier process for very small communities of faith to become Affirming?
- Communities of faith are still doing Affirming things but do not have the "seal of approval" from AUSE;
- How do I KNOW if I am an Affirming person or not? What does it mean to be "Affirming"? Need more education;
- Examples of what is Affirming and NOT Affirming;
- C of F can be given this information/educational programming without having to do the whole process with AUSE;
- P.I.E. (Public. Intentional. Explicit.) we need to be intentional about having educational information and events.

Will shared the Inclusivity Statement the Pastoral Relations Commission (PRC) has created for their portion of the CSRC Governance Document:

Commitment to Inclusivity and Diversity

The Pastoral Relations Commission is committed to exercising its oversight of the pastoral relations processes within the Canadian Shield Regional Council with intentional attention to ensuring that the values of inclusivity and diversity are upheld. It is the responsibility of the Pastoral Relations Commission to ensure that all pastoral relations processes grant unbiased and equal access to all persons regardless of their sexual orientation, gender identities and expressions, race, age, or disability.

Practices that encourage inclusivity and diversity include but are not limited to: i) training Liaisons working with communities of faith in dignity, bias and privilege;

ii) including bias and privilege training for all search committees; iii) reviewing community of faith profiles with attention to the authenticity of statements regarding inclusivity and welcome: iv) conversation within the PR Commission about resources available for ministry personnel and communities of faith dealing with issues related to sexual

orientation, gender identities and expressions, race, age, or disability.

Peter reiterated that there will be cuts to the CSRC Budget in 2021. The General Council Office (GCO) have made some substantial staff cuts this month in attempts to balance their budget, including staff in the Philanthropy Unit where Melody Duncanson Hales is employed part-time.

Executive revisited discussions around Melody's current job description and time allotment within the CSRC. Peter predicts that the CSRC staff support of lay leadership is going to increase over the coming years, while support to paid accountable ministry may decrease.

GC44 UPDATE AND ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS DELAYED UNTIL 2022?

Peter said that GC43 will be reconvening soon to make a decision as to whether to defer GC44 to 2022 or keep it in 2021. This will impact decisions at the fall online regional council meeting for the CSRC. Peter will update Executive when he has more information.





Peter shared with Executive that the CSRC has had a Town Hall meeting a few weeks ago and a "Kathie's Koffee Hour" zoom meeting last week. The first had a record number of people from the CSRC attending (144 people) and Kathie was pleasantly surprised to have 17 people join the koffee hour time. Another koffee hour is being planned for sometime in July.

The last Finance webinar offered by The UCC has been recorded and is on the United in Learning website for anyone who missed it. Details about the \$40,000 loans from the Government of Canada will be on there, among other items.

There have been many online church services springing up all across the CSRC and across the country. Peter reminded Executive that if they know of any regular Sunday Services that could be posted on the CSRC website to send the details to Susan in an email.

Executive was reminded to look at the CSRC Emergency Covid-19 webpage for all the latest Covid details and updates.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Janet MacDonald joined the Executive meeting to share the CSRC Financial Report (*Appendix A*). She is waiting for some updated HST information from the National Church in order to complete the report.

Janet shared she had initial concerns getting into the financial market just as Covid-19 hit. She has indicated that the financials have bounced back already.

GC43 UPDATE

Move of General Council 44 to Summer of 2022

GC43 Proposal - Towards an Anti-Racist Denomination

What is the issue?

Communities of Faith who want to be anti-racist and address the issue of anti-BIPOC racism need processes, resources, and structures from which to engage this ministry within the context of The United Church of Canada and the broader Canadian culture.

2. Why is this issue important?

- a. The United Church of Canada supports The United Nations declaration of the International Decade for People of African Descent 2015-2024, which states, in part, "In proclaiming this Decade, the international community is recognizing that people of African descent represent a distinct group whose human rights must be promoted and protected. Around 200 million people identifying themselves as being of African descent live in the Americas. Many millions more live in other parts of the world, outside of the African continent."
- b. On June 4, 2020, The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, The Anglican Church of Canada, and The United Church of Canada signed a joint statement that, in part says, "We are hearing the same voice from ministers of African descent, particularly as they pastor predominantly white congregations. This voice is tired of violence towards Black lives. This voice is tired of the exclusion of people of African descent in our structures of leadership. This voice is tired of the emptiness that comes from supposed allies who aren't willing to acknowledge their own privilege and responsibility."
- c. This moment in history is experiencing a rise in all forms of racism. Even a cursory read of the submissions to The United Nations Special Repporteur on Contemporary Forms of Racism, Xenophobia and Related Intolerance reveals that incidents of racism are on the rise in Canada. Equally distressing is an observation from a UN official who worked on the Report to the Working Group of Experts on People of African Descent on its mission to Canada, "History informs anti-Black racism and racial stereotypes that are so deeply entrenched in institutions, policies, and practices, that its institutional and systemic forms are either functionally normalized or rendered invisible, especially to the dominant group, this contemporary form of racism replicates the historical... conditions and effects of spatial segregation, economic disadvantage, and social exclusion." Anti-Black racism is part of the Canadian narrative that needs to be named for the evil it is and addressed head on.
- d. There is a social narrative in Canadian society that proclaims "we're too polite to be racist." The narrative focuses on Canada being the destination for the underground railroad and whitewashes the Canadian examples of slavery, segregated schools, and forced urban renewal. These pieces of Canada's history, and by extension the White church's role in it, needs to be acknowledged and addressed.
- e. Bruce Perry reminds us that "relationships matter; the currency for systemic change [is] trust and trust comes through forming healthy working relationships. People, not programs, change people." There are two pieces here for the church to ponder. The first is that trust has been broken time and again with the Black community. We need to

- admit and own this reality. Yes, we have taken steps to address it, yet people are still waiting, still unable to breath under the weight of racism that is crushing them. Secondly, it is the mission of the church to equip people to work for justice, in part, through systemic change. No program, in and of itself, will change people. That is true, yet change within systems, making processes anti-racist, fostering networks for anti-racist ministry, and providing resources both financial and programmatic, do equip the saints for ministry so that people with people can affect systemic change.
- f. Our full communion sister denomination, The United Church of Christ in the USA, has made the bold statement that, "racism is a deadly virus that white people must help eradicate." (Rev. Velda Love, Minister for Racial Justice) dealing with our systemic and institutional racism and shifting to be an anti-racist church is the work of the white church. It is not the work of the BIPOC church. The BIPOC church has its own work to do that we need to support, stand with, and listen to, yet it is the white church that needs to change the systems, processes, and procedures that have granted it such a privileged position.
- g. In a recent pastoral letter to The Pacific Mountain Region, President Rev. Jay Olsen reflected on Jesus and the disciples in the garden where Jesus says to Peter, "So, could you not stay awake with me one hour?" (Matt. 26:40) Could it be that the oppression of Black people is something that white people can't stay awake for? That the culture of white privilege is so prevalent and pervasive that it works like a sleeping pill so that no matter how well intentioned and desiring of change white people are, they just can't stay awake? Could it be that white people get so sleepy to their privilege that within a few news cycles we're back to blaming the victim because they weren't perfect (aka wasn't white enough) and then judge participation in the only economy to which they had full access: violence? Could the admonition of Jesus be a critique of white privilege as it resonates with the frustration, anger, and pain of BIPOC people around the world? Could you not stay awake, as in fully present to what is happening to Black people, for one hour? One day? Long enough to do any work on your own white privilege and help deconstruct the systems, processes, and institutions designed to perpetuate it? Is it time for the white church to do its work and not fall asleep?
- h. On The United Church of Canada website there is a prayer entitled, "That All May be One." It is based on A New Creed, John 17:21, and the Statement of Faith. It says, in part, "Uniting God, you call us into your church to accept the cost and joy of discipleship: to celebrate your presence,...to seek justice and resist evil" Has the white church avoided the cost of dismantling its white privilege for too long? Has The United Church of Canada avoided the cost of discipleship by avoiding making a bold statement that we, as a church, are against anti-Black racism and believe, without a doubt, that Black lives matter? Has The United Church of Canada, even with all of the ministry we have engaged in alongside our global and ecumenical partners, avoided the real cost of being anti-racist? By not using the fullness of our voice are we perpetuating the evil of anti-Black racism rather than resisting it every way we can?
- Perhaps the time has come to have an invitational theology that seeks to widen our understanding and language about God. An invitational theology that resists and

overturns the power of an expansionist colonial theology that still serves as the foundation for progressive and fundamentalist theologies alike. Perhaps the existing dichotomy of progressive and fundamentalist which still serves to segregate and alienate, to create in groups and 'right' groups, those who talk about God in the 'right' (often meaning white) way and those who don't, needs to be intentionally and deliberately dismantled.

j. Public statements are not enough. Words are not enough. This is a moment for The United Church of Canada to wrestle with its white privilege, its role in systematizing anti-Black racism within its own policies, procedures, and practices, and its role within the wider Canadian context. There is a need to make becoming an anti-racist denomination and dealing with anti-Black racism within our denomination a missional priority at all levels of the denomination.

How might the General Council respond to the issue?

The General Council Executive could consider the following options, engage in a strategic planning process, prioritization, and implementation strategy; and report back the next time the General Council gathers (electronically or in-person):

a. Make a statement like:

"Recent events have illustrated how far we must go to truly enter into the call of loving our neighbour. It has exposed some very disturbing truths about our society and who we are as disciples of Jesus. We, The General Council of The United Church of Canada, acknowledge that anti-Black racism and racism in general has existed and exists in our structures, systems, and communities. We acknowledge that The United Church of Canada is actively working towards being an anti-racist church and that progress is slow. As an expression of solidarity with Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour and a commitment to engage in developing processes that facilitate real change, we state that in The United Church of Canada – Black Lives Matter and anti-Black racism will not be tolerated. We lament that we have not lived into our identity of a being a community that truly love its neighbours. We commit ourselves to developing policies, procedures, and processes that embody this statement and will take action to repent our white privilege and re-turn to the hard work of truly loving neighbour, becoming allies, and eliminating racism in all its forms wherever it is found."

- b. Clearly state a missional goal for the denomination to become an anti-racist church.
- Leverage the work of the White Privilege Working Group to engage the church in the creation of an anti-racist education and certification process.
- d. Learn from the Affirming Ministry process to assist in developing an ongoing process that facilitates communities being able to publicly state a community is actively working on being an anti-racist church.
- Build upon the work that has been started in various ways across the denomination (for example the Black Lives Matter to the United Church Facebook group) in order to create a network that addresses anti-Black racism.

- Expand and update the Racial Justice training program to include regional council
 executive members and local governing body members as part of those required to take
 the training.
- g. Develop a living resource page (for example: https://www.pmrfirstthirdresources.ca/anti-racism-resources.html) that is part of the denomination website. This resource could include stories curated from Black people within the denomination related to their experience of anti-Black racism.
- h. Allocate staff time and budget support sufficient to launch a network and maintain it.
- Encourage Regional Councils to develop their own network within their region that would also be a connectional space to the national network.
- Encourage Regional Councils to allocate staff and financial support to maintain both the regional and national networks.
- k. Engage in a review of all policies, practices, and procedures (particularly the new Search process) using the lens of being an anti-racist church; report the findings to the GCE; and direct the GS to implement changes.
- Make anti-racism part of the discernment and preparation for ministry process, such that white candidates must unpack their white privilege.
- Require of all candidates a commitment to be part of an anti-racist church prior to Admission, Recognition, Commissioning, or Ordination.
- Incorporate being an anti-racist church into the covenanting process with Communities
 of Faith and community partners.
- Add to the Ethical Standards and Standards of Practice for Ministry Personnel a clear statement requiring ministry personnel to engage in ministry in a manner that is antiracist.
- Train Regional Pastoral Relations Ministers to support Ministry and Personnel Committees as they support Ministry Personnel in confronting anti-Black racism.
- q. Build upon and create ecumenical partnerships that broaden the circle of allies.



Kathie Smith welcomed everyone to the meeting of Executive.

Kathie honoured the traditional lands upon which we meet with the following words:

"The lands where we gather today have been places of gathering for First Nations people as they camped and travelled across the land for generations beyond our knowing. Before people arrived from across the seas, these Nations lived, loved, raised children and made a living. They lived in harmony with all that the Creator had made. As we gather today, we recognize those traditional sojourners in this land. We give thanks for them and for the lands on which we meet. We acknowledge that our history has come at a great cost to the aboriginal community and we commit ourselves to be partners in healing and reconciliation with understanding and intention." (Adapted – Acknowledging the Land, 2016)

Kathie then read the CSRC safe space statement:

GS 58 EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS RE: PASTORAL RELATIONS

Origin: General Secretary, General Council

1. What is the issue?

In April, 2020, the Executive of the General Council approved a temporary change in pastoral relations policies to allow the governing bodies of communities of faith to make urgent pastoral relations decisions on behalf of the community of faith within strict parameters and under the oversight of the regional council [copy of motion attached].

This action was necessary because communities of faith were prohibited from gathering in person due to the COVID-19 pandemic and were therefore unable to make pastoral relations decisions that required a community of faith meeting.

Staff report that the amendment has been very useful during this time, facilitating many changes made to pastoral relationships:

- Ministers have moved (terminating existing relationships, moving and starting new relationships);
- Pastoral relationships have been altered (hours changed);
- Ministers have retired;
- Candidates have begun appointments.

In addition, communities of faith have been doing other work with respect to matters like amalgamations, which will then have an effect on pastoral relationships. The amendment has been helpful in facilitating these matters. Staff are not aware of any problems which have been caused by this amendment.

Pension and Benefits reports that they have been advised of only one ministry personnel lay off requesting continuation of benefits. There may be others who will become apparent when they attempt to access benefits. (Sixty-four lay staff members were reported laid off, ten of whom have now been reported as returned to work.)

The temporary change expires on August 31, 2020, unless extended by decision of the Executive or Sub-Executive of the General Council.

Although public health restrictions have now eased to varying degrees across Canada, many communities of faith are not yet gathering in person because of safety concerns. In communities of faith that have resumed worship services with health protocols in place, it may still be too risky for their vulnerable members and adherents to participate in person.

Communities of faith need a mechanism to make pastoral relations decisions in the coming months so that they can continue to function effectively.

3. How might the General Council Executive respond to the issue?

The Executive of the General Council has responsibility for dealing with all emergency work of the General Council between meetings of the General Council [D.5.3].

The Executive of the General Council extend the temporary amendments to pastoral relations policies adopted at the meeting of the Sub-Executive held on April 15, 2020 to December 31, 2020, subject to earlier cancellation or further extension by decision of the Executive or Sub-Executive of the General Council.

- for the purposes of this motion, "urgent" means a critical situation that cannot be effectively dealt with under any other bylaw or policy of the United Church, as determined to the satisfaction of the regional council;
- the governing body will consult with the community of faith in advance of making a
 pastoral relations decision to the extent reasonable and practicable in the
 circumstances to the satisfaction of the regional council;
- when the governing body is making a pastoral relations decision, the ministry personnel will have the same right to notice of the virtual meeting and an opportunity to respond as provided in section I.3.1.6 of *The Manual*; in this instance, section B.5.4.2 shall be interpreted as nine days where it is not practicable to read during public worship on two Sundays;
- iv) when the governing body of a community of faith requests a change of pastoral relations, the regional council will ask the ministry personnel affected if they support the request. If the ministry personnel do not support the request, the requirement that the minister is given 90 days' notice or salary and benefits in lieu of notice as provided in section I.3.1.6 will continue to apply, save for the following circumstances, where notice may be abridged or waived by the regional council upon recommendation of the governing body of the community of faith:

if the change to the terms and conditions of the call or appointment is the temporary layoff of the ministry personnel relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the governing body of the community of faith has:

- declared its intention on behalf of the community of faith to recall the affected minister upon cessation of the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- b) demonstrated to the satisfaction of regional council that it has exhausted all funding sources;
- all other requirements for making a pastoral relations decision, including minimum advance notice of the meeting and notice to the regional council, will apply to the extent possible, and with only such modifications as may be necessary in the circumstances as permitted by the regional council;

- this change will be in effect until August 31, 2020, subject to earlier cancellation or extension by decision of the Executive or Sub-Executive of the General Council.

Milestones/ Retirement Letters

Milestone letters have been sent out and the reaction was mixed. There was some positive feedback but others felt the acknowledgement of their work came too late. Perhaps there should be some follow-up around how the letters are received.

Support to Ministry Personnel An online meeting was held Tuesday September 15th with Ministry Personnel from around the region to discuss what's coming up this fall. There was also discussion of holding a retreat at some future time when conditions allow.

Correspondence

A letter was received from Heather Olmstead, the Treasurer for Mattawa Pastoral Charge inquiring if it would be possible to waive the supervision fees due to financial constraints caused by COVID-19. The following discussion about supervision and remuneration took place:

- The work of supervision, which is a manual requirement, continues even if worship is not happening. Should we be giving churches a break? The consensus was that this is a nominal amount and is symbol of respect for the work that supervisors do. Churches pay the CSRC and then a cheque is issued to each supervisor. It was agreed that 3rd quarter statements from CSRC should be sent out with information about the role of the supervisor. Heather Olmstead's letter has brought to our attention that there may be a need for a broader conversation about supervision and for more education about the purpose of supervision.
- The letter also highlights the fact that some churches may need more guidance about how to manage their finances during the pandemic by pointing them to programs that may be available to help. Communities of Faith should be finding a way to encourage members to donate even when services are not being held.
- Rob Smith will follow up with Rev. Rick Thorne, the supervisor of Mattawa Pastoral Charge.

New Business

Resource Team Updates

Resource Team The liaisons are doing great work.

- A Manitoulin pastoral charge going into search mode with Stewart Walker as the liaison.
- Chalmers United, part of the two point South River Pastoral Charge is disbanding while the Trout Creek United wants to continue. They are looking at connecting with Zion United in Sundridge through a collaborative ministry agreement.

Consensus Packet

The Consensus Packet was circulated by email before the meeting. There was a brief discussion about the status of Pam Brown, who is a student from AST that has not yet had worship training.  inform congregations if an LLWL chooses not to relicense. Some choose not to go
 through the interview process if they are only preaching in their home
 congregations because they don't want to go through the training.
- In reality, any lay person can preach, but they have no accountability and there is minimum requirement regarding what they will be paid if they are not on our pulpit supply list. There is currently no recourse if LLWL's are not used. Is there a problem with this?
- Perhaps an updated pulpit supply list with a preamble about the value of a license should be sent out to congregations yearly in addition to the website posting to ensure that we have done due diligence if case there are any problems that arise with unlicensed preachers.
- There were questions for follow-up regarding insurance and Police Record Checks (PRC). There in nothing in the LLWL policy about PRC's so some research may be needed to determine how often one is required and reporting procedures we should be using.





- Perhaps there should be discussion on how we can work with the Support to Communities of Faith Commission (SCFC) since there may be some overlap in the work concerning supervision. Supervisors are required to do a yearly report about the C of F under their supervision and this may be the only real connection congregations have with the region. Some C of F's may be drifting, especially during these challenging times.
- Should supervisors be trying to encourage C of F's who are not actively looking for ministry personnel? This is not part of the supervisor's role however the

situation should be noted in their yearly report. Some are happy to be on the edge of the church, but we should be trying to find ways to include them in the wider church community. What is the purpose of a C of F if they are just serving themselves?

 concern about how to ensure that C of F's formally covenant with the region. This





ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT OF CANADIAN SHIELD REGIONAL COUNCIL EXECUTIVE

It has been an eventful year to say the least with a global pandemic declared on March 11, 2020 challenging the status quo. We have also continued work around the Calls to the Church, Black Lives Matters, Intercultural and Diverse Communities, and working towards becoming an affirming Region.

With our shift from a Transition Commission to Regional Executive, our new Executive spent this past year working hard to support the work of the Region but also becoming familiar with each other and the work of the Executive within the Region while living into our new governance structure.

The Executive continues to work on decisions and policies which provide a basic structure to support the immediate and on-going work of the region and our communities of faith. The Executive continues to live into its new governance structure approved at our 2019 Regional meeting. We have been grateful for the work of our commissions, committees, resource teams, networks, clusters, communities of faith, outreach ministries, and staff.

Covid-19

The Regional Council Executive and staff shifted quickly in the spring of 2020 with the declaration of a pandemic. The Regional Council staff and Executive have worked towards supporting our communities of faith, which make up our region, with frequent Town Hall meetings for both lay and ministry personnel with a focus on addressing the daily challenges of Covid-19, from staffing, to budgets, to rental agreements. In addition, the national Church has provided many webinars supporting our many ministries through this difficult period.

We hesitate to use the word unprecedented times; our nation and church lived through a pandemic in 1918. Nevertheless, we continue to live through this challenging period supporting each other, walking together, and experimenting with new forms of electronic worship and meeting.

Practically speaking, Easter was celebrated in new ways, worship in our buildings was cancelled for many months, we delayed our Regional meeting and many communities of faith shifted to online worship and doing ministry in new and creative ways.

Confronting Racism in the Church and Society:

The Executive continues to consider and prioritize the important work of confronting racism in the Church and society. The Regional Council, the Executive, the Commissions and Committees, the Resource Teams, the Regional staff, along with many communities of faith, are actively being encouraged to discuss and work on ways to address racism in our Church and in society and work toward Right Relations.

Continuing as an Affirming Region:

Our Regional Council meeting in May 2019 supported continuing the relationship with Affirm United. The CSRC Affirming Ministry Resource Team has worked through the year preparing for our Regional Meeting and affirmation as an Affirming Region.

Staffing:

Staffing is a large component of the budget of any organization. The Executive, along with the Executive Minister, continues to develop a staffing model for our Regional Council.

2019/2020 has seen a significant shift in staffing with the Retirement of Lillian Roberts, who has served The United Church of Canada for many years. Will Kunder will also retire December 31, 2020. Both retirements mark a milestone for our Regional Council as they have served our region so faithfully. I have treasured working with both Lillian and Will and I wish them well in this new chapter in their life and ministry. I thank them for their many years of service.

In 2020, Rob Smith shifted from part-time to full-time, as he has taken on the role of Regional Pastoral Relations Minister in August of 2020. I look forward to working with Rob for many years.

Melody Duncanson-Hales, who worked part-time for the Region, has now shifted to full-time for the Canadian Shield Regional Council.

Work, Governance and Policies for the Regional Executive:

The Executive acts as the region between meetings of the Regional Council. The Executive offers oversight for the regional work on your behalf. Our governance structure is designed to support the work of the region from ministry and mission, including justice work and networks/clusters, Right Relations, and Affirming work. Our Executive has two commissions (the Pastoral Relations and the Support to Communities of Faith Commissions) which support the work of the region, along with Resource Teams (RT) like the Youth and Young Adult (YaYa) RT, the Finance RT, and the Property RT. The RTs work hard at meetings, on policy, and so many other things. We are so thankful that these volunteers take time out of their days to assist the region.

Commissions/Committees:

- 1. The Support to Communities of Faith Commission (SCoFC), supports the work of communities of faith visioning, transitioning, and growth. This includes supporting communities of faith in areas such as clusters, networks, visioning, amalgamation, disbanding, and property matters.
- 2. The Pastoral Relations Commission (PRC) support our communities of faith by supporting ministry personnel throughout their ministry including equipping, covenanting, pastoral relationships retirement, along with supporting the important work of Pastoral Charge Supervisors. The commission also supports our LLWL (Licenced Lay Worship Leaders) training and on-going work, an important partnership for our Regional Council.
- 3. The Nominations Committee always works tirelessly before a regional council meeting to fill positions we require to keep the region functioning. This is a vital role within the region that we are greatly appreciative of.

Our Executive has worked tirelessly throughout the year, especially in support of our Communities of Faith and Ministry during Covid-19. They have been nimble, attentive and pro-active. I have

NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

At the May 31 – June 1, 2019 Regional Council Meeting the Nominations Committee Mandate, Responsibilities and Membership were approved as part of the approval of the Canadian Shield Regional Council Governance Structure.

The Committee will consist of six (6) members: Two members of the Executive, The Chair Elect or the Past Chair will chair the Committee; Four members of the United Church who are from within the bounds of the Canadian Shield Regional Council.

Members of the Committee are:

Jim Jackson, *Trinity United, Thunder Bay*Helen Smith, *East Korah Maxwell, Sault Ste. Marie*Janice Brownlee, *Trinity United, North Bay*Mardi Mumford, *Trinity United, Lively*

All of the Committee meetings have been held using Zoom.

The Committee met as necessary throughout the past 16 months with the following work being completed.

- ❖ By April 23, 2020 Janice Brownlee and Mardi Mumford were added to the Committee.
- ❖ The CSRC EXEC had decided not to have a Region Council Meeting in June. As a result the Nominating Committee decided to ask all those completing the one year term to which they were elected in June 2019 if they would be willing to undertake a second three year term. Most people opted to continue for a new three year term.
- Additionally Bill Steadman agreed to stay for an additional year (to June 2021) as the Chair of the Support to Communities of Faith Commission, and Karen Gooch agreed to be Secretary of the Support to Communities of faith Commission until the 2021 annual meeting. Both Bill and Karen were placed on the Commission by decision of the Executive.
- Available positions in Canadian Shield Regional Council Structure for 2020 and beyond
 - One vacancy in the Executive
 - Two vacancies in Nominating Committee
 - No vacancies in Pastoral Relations Commission
 - No vacancies in Support to Communities of Faith Commission
 - Three vacancies in Property Resource Team
 - No Vacancies in Mission Support and Grants Resource Team
 - No Vacancies in Right Relations Resource Team
 - Two Vacancies in Affirming Ministries Resource Team
 - No Vacancies in Finance Resource Team
 - Six vacancies in Youth and Young Adult Resource Team

❖ A Nominations "Best Practices" Statement was developed.

Canadian Shield Nominations Best Practices Spring 2020

Issue: The best practice process when a person is completing their current term of appointment/election and is eligible to serve a second term.

Background:

- 1. The current governance document does not address whether those completing a first term are to be the first option of renewing for a second terms before the position is posted for nominations.
- 2. In 2019 some people were intentionally asked to serve a shorter term (less than the normal 3 year term) in order to stagger the terms within the Executive and Commissions.

Considerations:

- 1. Wanting to honour the contribution of those who are currently serving. It was felt that failing to offer an extension to the term could be viewed as not valuing the service that a person has to offer.
- It is also recognized that there is a certain tension in asking folks to extend their service into a second term in regards to opportunity for new leadership to be identified and to emerge. Always asking folks to renew for a second term limits the number of opportunities for new people to engage.

Best practice:

- 1. Those completing terms in 2020 be asked if they are willing to renew their appointment/election for another term **before** the position is posted as open for nominations.
- 2. The person must be willing to renew for an entire new term of 3 years. This is necessary to maintain the staggered terms that were established in 2019.
- 3. Only positions that are vacant by virtue of resignation, or the decision by the person to not undertake a second term will be made available in the 2020 nominations process.
- ❖ A Nominations Process for electing Commissioners to GC 44 was developed and approved by the CSRC Executive. However, GC 43 was reconvened and a decision was made to move GC 44 to 2022. This means that Election of our Regional Commissioners should be voted on in a timely fashion in 2021. Possibly as early as the 2021 CSRC meeting.

Nomination Process for Commissioners to GC44

There are 9 positions available to the Canadian Shield Regional Council

Principles of nominations:

- Equitable representation lay persons and ministry personnel
- Attention to the principles of diversity as set forth by the General Council
- Importance of there being representation of the regional council executive through its serving chair

Importance of encouraging engagement and leadership from youth

Designated Commission by Office in the Regional Council

That the person serving as chair of the regional council, at the time of the General Council 44 meeting be automatically designated as a Commissioner to the General Council 44.

This is a policy recommendation and would need approval by the regional council.

Nominations Process

Intentional Diversity Practice

Within the 8 remaining positions for commissioners to GC44 that the regional council designate:

One position be for an Indigenous representative (lay or ministry personnel) One positions be for a person self-identifying as racialized (lay or ministry personnel)

One position be for a youth/young adult (lay or ministry personnel)

Nominations for the remaining positions be distributed to maintain equal representation between lay and ministry personnel.

Nominations would be invited *through the nominations portal of the Canadian Shield Regional Council webpage*, using the criteria and form developed by the nominations committee. The one **exception would be for the youth position**. In this instance, the Youth and Young Adult Resource Team would be asked to manage a nominations process and to bring the resulting nomination to the regional council for election.

Call for Nominations Letter and Questionnaire will be made available on the CSRC website. The same information will be made available in a mail out.

Voting Process

Designated Position given to Chair – no vote, automatic

Three (3) designated positions for diversity – these would be on the first ballot of those nominated and elected first by the Regional Council prior to presenting the second ballot for the remaining positions.

Remaining 5 positions – would be presented after the first ballot, in a second ballot so that the regional council was aware of the lay/ministry personnel representation already elected. Voters would then be given direction as to the number of lay positions for which they are voting and the number of ministry personnel positions for which they are voting.

Nominations would be invited through the webpage "nominations portal" using the same template as nominations for 2019, but including information about category of nomination – indigenous, racialized, lay, ministry personnel. Those nominations received by the closing date posted on the webpage would be included in the report book for the regional council meeting. It would be the

SUPPORT TO COMMUNITIES OF FAITH COMMISSION

The Commission that offers Support to Local Communities of Faith has met each month over the last 17 months since our June, 2019 meeting of the Canadian Shield Region (except for the summer months). Our work falls under a number of areas of responsibility that are reported on separately in this document. This report is to point you to those other reports and offer an understanding of the general responsibilities of the Commission. Our list of members is offered at the end of this document.

Main Responsibility of Commission

The main purpose of this commission is to offer support to local communities of faith. One of the primary responsibilities in helping congregations and communities of faith in the development of their profile and entering into a covenant with the region. We began a process of testing ways to support congregations and communities of faith in the winter of 2020, but the arrival of the restrictions due to COVID-19 meant that local communities no longer were meeting in person and so the consultation process has been put on pause to be picked up as soon as possible.

Property Resource Team

One of the main support areas is working with congregations around financial issues and property management.

The Property Resource Team, chaired by Gord Roberts, has developed a thorough Policy and Procedures Manual to guide congregations on their property management and approval processes for major capital programs. It is available on the Canadian Shield Web Page. Some highlights of that document:

1) Communities of Faith looking at major renovations of \$75,000 or more **should** consult the Property Resource Team for approval and guidance.

- Communities of Faith looking at renovations or capital costs of less than \$75,000 are encouraged to consult the Property Resource Team to help with meeting the needs of the community in such a project.
- 3) Congregations seeking amalgamation or closure are asked to develop a clear process in conjunction with the Property Resource Team and approved by the Commission. Details on these processes are in the Policy and Procedures Manual.
- 4) All details around the sale of property for whatever reason also are outlined in the Property Policies and Procedures Manual.

Mission Support & Regional Council Grants Resource Team

The Mission Support and Regional Council Grants Resource Team recommend successful applicants for Mission Funding through Mission and Service. This resource team is chaired by Diane Trollope. It also has dealt with applications from congregations seeking funding through government programs related to support of not-for-profit organizations in the midst of the Pandemic. Due to the time sensitivity of many of these applications they have met on a very regular basis (at times, weekly) in order to handle effectively the work load given to them. We appreciate their thoroughness and sensitivity in handling the issues that come before them.

Right Relations Resource Team

The Right Relations Resource Team is our main link to how we seek to live into Right Relations with our Indigenous Sisters and Brothers. In recent months the team has worked at updating some of the Right Relations Minutes for Mission developed within Manitou Conference, and have encouraged us in our responsibility to identify indigenous communities within the boundaries of our region. As a Commission we encourage all communities of faith to seek meaningful ways to develop and enhance right relations with indigenous communities within or near their pastoral area.

Affirming Ministry Resource Team

The Affirming Ministry Resource Team seeks ways to encourage the region in its intention to be an affirming body within The United Church of Canada. Peter Haddow of our Commission chairs this resource team. The Affirming Ministry Resource Team also is willing to work with groups or communities of faith seeking to enter into an affirming process. We have spent a significant time in two of our meetings looking at the mandate of the Affirming Ministry Resource Team and seeking ways that we can support this resource team in its work. We identified one way to be supportive is to make sure the issue of being an Affirming Ministry is addressed in every Community of Faith when developing a mission statement and seeking clarity in its purpose and sharing in God's mission to the community.

Youth & Young Adult Ministry Resource Team

This resource team, often identified by its shortened acronym YAYA, has played an important role in the early stages of the Canadian Shield Region, but the work of this Resource Team has been limited in the COVID-19 shut down. Face to face meetings with youth have been put on hiatus, and connecting with congregational leaders of youth has been made more challenging. Camping also was not possible in 2020, which affected camper programs at Camp McDougall. Many youth in the region did connect with the virtual Rendezvous gathering originally planned for Calgary in August, 2020. We look forward to a time when this area of our work once again will be a source of energy and excitement.

United Church in Worship Project

2019/2020 - 202

George Bott is a member of our Commission and with his partner Joy provides the main support to the United Church in Worship project. Our Commission has supported funding requests of this ministry, and have kept abreast of the ways that this project supports ministry and worship leadership for congregations without regular order of ministry personnel throughout the north. This ministry keeps expanding as more and more congregations are unable to procure ministry leadership, even part time. We feel honoured to be the home region of this outreach ministry.

Other Items of Note:

Equity officer

With issues of fairness in staffing and volunteer allocations becoming front and centre as a society, we discussed the need to have an equity officer in our region. A task group has been established to examine this issue, and will develop a meeting time and report to the Commission in the near future.

Social Justice Network:

Ernie Epp, a member of the Commission, is the Canadian Shield representative to the Social Justice Network of Ontario (along with Will Kunder). Ernie recently reported on that work, and raised concerns as to how we can be faithful as a region in facilitating the social justice work of the region. We agreed this was an area that needed to be addressed by the whole region, and so we have asked for time on the agenda of the Regional meeting in November. This network originally was established over 30 years ago to connect what was then all Conferences within the province of Ontario in order to have a common United Church voice to address public policy within the province of Ontario.

AFFIRMING MINISTRIES RESOURCE TEAM

Prior to restructuring of The United Church of Canada on January 1, 2019, Algoma Presbytery, Cambrian Presbytery, and Manitou Conference had all been designated as Affirming Ministries, by Affirm United/s'Affirmer Ensemble.

When restructuring took place, there was expectation within our constituency that the Canadian Shield Regional Council would automatically be designated an Affirming Ministry, since all of the constituent parts that formed the new regional council, had done the work and been previously recognized.

Affirm United/s'Affirmer Ensemble determined, however, that each of the new regional councils would be granted 'interim affirming status," but would need to follow steps in order to attain full affirming accreditation.

At the 2019 Inaugural Regional Council Meeting (Sault Ste. Marie), the court authorized the Affirming Ministry Resource Team to do the work necessary for affirming ministry designation to be achieved.

In 2020, the resource team met with representatives from Affirm United to discuss their requirements. The key item was to develop a new "Affirming Ministry Statement," intended to guide the life of our regional council.

Each governance entity within our regional council was asked to respond to the following:

- 1. As the Canadian Shield Regional Council works toward our Affirming Ministry designation, how is your area of the region's governance structure living out our affirming commitment within its responsibility and function?
- 2. What might we be doing to demonstrate our commitment to the affirming process in the year ahead?

Feedback guided the Affirming Ministry Resource Team in crafting the draft "Affirming Ministry Statement" for consideration at this general meeting.

Of note, the Pastoral Relations Commission took steps to amend their handbook to explicitly assert that all persons are welcome into the full life and ministry of the church.

Below is the draft "Affirming Ministry Statement" the Affirming RT hopes to be approved:

As an Affirming community, the Canadian Shield Regional Council welcomes and supports lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and two-spirited (LGBTQ+) people in all aspects of the life, work, worship and governance of the church. We believe that all people are children of God; that persons of all ages, races, abilities, and sexual orientations are part of our increasingly diverse culture; and we welcome all persons into the full life and ministry of the church.

We aspire for members of the LGBTQ+ community to find the churches and governing bodies in our Regional Council to be safe places to worship and share gifts.

An increasing number of our churches proudly march in Pride Parades each year behind banners proclaiming who we are. Many of our members are also present at community events in support of the LGBTQ+ community.

The Canadian Shield Regional Council is fully supportive of Affirm United as we strive to continue to be supportive and accepting of all with whom we are in relationship. Please visit their website www.affirmunited.ca to learn more.

Our Regional Council acknowledges that God's love is wider and more inclusive than we can imagine, let alone live out, and we commit ourselves to sharing that news with others who may have heard a quite different message about what it means to be church. Because voices of condemnation, exclusion, and hatred are loud and persistent within the church and in society, we declare that it is important to be a public witness and to be a role model for other ministries. The purpose of the Capital Assistance Fund is to provide financial assistance for the renewal and development of congregations, camps, education centres, community ministries, and chaplaincies. Assistance is available in the form of loans and targeted grants for eligible pastoral charges/congregations and other ministries that would otherwise be unable to undertake or complete these projects. These programs include Technology Support Grants, Church and Manse Modernization Grants, and Capital Assistance Loans. Since temporarily freezing funding due to pandemic restrictions, The United Church of Canada Capital Assistance programs have resumed and the Grants team is currently reviewing applications and recommends awards from The United Church of Canada

Capital Assistance Loan awarded to Trinity UC, Manitoulin (\$25,000 in support of accessibility project)

Church Modernization Grant awarded to Trinity UC, Manitoulin (\$5,000 matching grant in support of accessibility project)

Church Modernization Grant awarded to Restoule UC, Nipissing PC, Restoule ON (\$5,000 matching grant in support of roof repair)

Pandemic Emergency Funding

United Church of Canada Pandemic Bridging Loan: This is a short-term emergency loan program for congregations during the pandemic. Loans of up to \$10,000 are available to communities of faith that need a short-term top-up after they have accessed the government programs available or are transitioning out of the government benefits. Grants Team reviews applications and recommends awards from The United Church of Canada.

Canadian Emergency Business Account

This \$55 billion federal program provides interest-free loans of up to \$40,000 to small businesses and not-for-profits. Repaying the balance of the loan on or before December 31, 2022 will result in loan forgiveness of 25 percent (up to \$10,000). RIGHT RELATIONS RESOURCE TEAM

The Canadian Shield Regional Council's Right Relation Resource Team (RRRT) was created following the 2018 General Meeting. The RRRT carries on the work initiated by the Living into Right Relations Home Group and other reconciliation efforts initiated by groups from across our region.

The purpose of the *Right Relations Resource team* is to develop, support and nurture just and respectful relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples.

To achieve this, we endeavour to do the following:

- Actively seek out ways to advocate and support the work of reconciliation throughout our region.
- Educate re: The Truth and Reconciliation Commission "Calls to Action" and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and suggest ways to respond concretely.
- Share truth and endeavour to increase cultural competency about things such as: Canada's and the church's role in the colonization of Indigenous Peoples; generational impacts of residential schools; systemic racism; restoration of language, culture, spirituality and treaties.
- Encourage the church's presence where and when Indigenous Peoples are seeking justice, celebrating, remembering, mourning, learning, protesting, rallying, praying...and show up!
- Research and share appropriate resources to build capacity, encourage local leadership development, and empower and equip the church to do this work

Key projects that support this work since 2019 include:

- Support for Indigenous Efforts
 - Encouraged letter writing regarding the ongoing dispute between the Wet'suwe'ten and Coastal GasLink Pipeline relating to traditional territory as well as Covid-19 health and safety concerns.
 - Encouraged letter writing and petition signing in support of Bill C-262 (which, sadly, did not go through) and UNDRIP (United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples)
 - Promoted events and social justice action efforts such as: Have a Heart Day,
 Orange Shirt Day, Sisters in Spirit Vigils and Indigenous Day of Prayer
- Minute for Right Relations a series of brief informative articles intended to support Right Relations work across our region that can be read during worship, meetings, study groups or for personal reflection.
- Encouraged attendance at Indigenous-led events Provided information to the Conference about events such as pow wows, Sisters in Spirit, Orange Shirt Day, commemorations of those who attended the IRS, etc.
- Assisted in populating the Regional Council website material for Right Relations
- Provided funding for the Thunder Bay Cluster to host the Kairos Blanket Exercise

ATLANTIC SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

Report to the Regions Spring 2020

Academic year 2019-20 has been a year unlike any other. Atlantic School of Theology posted a banner enrollment, with 183 students. This is our highest enrollment in many, many years. And of course, we finished the year with a pandemic, scrambling to shift all courses to the online environment, and ensuring that those who have worked so hard to graduate would be able to receive their degrees and diplomas, even without an in-person Convocation. With considerable faith, resourcefulness, and inspiration, our students, staff, and faculty rallied. It has been stressful, but we have done it together. We are so grateful to our church partners – you! – for your faithful support.

We have students from every Canadian province and a few in the USA as well. Our expanding Summer Distance MDiv program allows students to "earn while they learn," serving in a local church part-time and studying part-time over five years. Interest in the Master of Arts (Theology and Religious Studies) program is growing, especially among ministers who already have the MDiv degree.

In the past year, our Continuing Education offerings have also expanded, including on-campus and online offerings. An innovative Preaching Masterclass, workshops on Eldercare and Parish Nursing, an online program on Feminist Spirituality, an on-campus program on Indigenous Spirituality, and a drumming and song circle were among the many opportunities for lifelong

learning for lay and clergy folks. Several of our for-credit graduate courses are also open to Continuing Education participants.

As the academic year draws to a close, we are saying a fond and grateful farewell to Dr. Joan Campbell, CSM, who has taught at AST since 2005. We will miss her dedication, scholarship, good humour, and excellent teaching. Sister Joan is returning to PEI to live.

Looking ahead, our popular Summer term will be fully online in 2020, and planning is underway for the fall. AST will face a significant shortfall in revenues (due to the closure of our residence for at least one term, among other financial pressures), but we will weather the storm.

AST exists to serve our churches and our society. Please let us know how we can serve you. Inquiries about programs of study and about Pine Hill Divinity Hall's generous finanical support for students are always welcome.

Report to the Regions Fall 2020

Pandemic Response

The Emmanuel College community has been responsive and resilient as Victoria University in the University of Toronto responds to public health concerns. With a few exceptions in the winter term, Emmanuel College courses are online this year. Internal and external events on Victoria University's campus are on hold, at least until December. Other events—such as the Christian Left Conference this summer—have shifted to online formats. Faculty have transitioned from emergency remote delivery to online pedagogies with the guidance of our new Instructional Design professor, Dr. Matthew Dougherty. The content of our courses has adapted as well, with Dr. Pamela McCarroll's new online "Pandemic Spiritual Care" summer course for students needing a curricular substitute for canceled CPE units. The Emmanuel College Library began offering curbside pickup service on September 14. Spiritual care practices, including Wednesday Chapel, are offered Monday through Thursday. Our new Spiritual and Community Life Program Manager, Dr. Sam Cavanagh, can help members of the wider community to connect. We hope you will join us!

Billes Grant provides 100% tuition support to all full-time domestic students registered in the Master of Divinity (MDiv) program and who are in The United Church of Canada Candidacy Pathway. Annual Fund Priority

This year's Annual Fund donations will be allocated toward emergency support for students facing financial hardship due to the pandemic. International students have been particularly vulnerable. We appreciate your generosity and support.

ATS Reaccreditation

Emmanuel College is preparing to submit our self-study report for reaccreditation by the Association of Theological Schools by the end of this academic year. Under the steady leadership of Dr. Nevin Reda, we are on pace to have draft completed by the end of 2020 so that we can receive feedback from a variety of constituencies. The self-study site visit is scheduled to take place September 27-30, 2021.

PROPOSAL TO CANADIAN SHIELD REGIONAL COUNCIL #2020-01

Proposal 2020 CSRC #1: Towards Becoming an Affirming Regional Council

Origin: Affirming Ministry Resource Team

1. What is the issue?

Prior to restructuring of The United Church of Canada on January 1, 2019, Algoma Presbytery, Cambrian Presbytery, and Manitou Conference had all been designated as Affirming Ministries, by Affirm United/s'Affirmer Ensemble.

When restructuring took place, there was expectation within our constituency that the Canadian Shield Regional Council would automatically be designated an Affirming Ministry, since all of the constituent parts that formed the new regional council, had done the work and been previously recognized.

Affirm United/s'Affirmer Ensemble determined, however, that each of the new regional councils would be granted 'interim affirming status," but would need to follow steps in order to attain full affirming accreditation.

2. Why is this issue important?

At the 2019 Inaugural Regional Council Meeting (Sault Ste. Marie), the court authorized the Affirming Ministry Resource Team to do the work necessary for affirming ministry designation to be achieved.

In 2020, the resource team met with representatives from Affirm United to discuss their requirements. The key item was to develop a new "Affirming Ministry Statement," intended to guide the life of our regional council.

Each governance entity within our regional council was asked to respond to the following:

- 1. As the Canadian Shield Regional Council works toward our Affirming Ministry designation, how is your area of the region's governance structure living out our affirming commitment within its responsibility and function?
- 2. What might we be doing to demonstrate our commitment to the affirming process in the year ahead?

Feedback guided the Affirming Ministry Resource Team in crafting the draft "Affirming Ministry Statement" for consideration at this general meeting.

Of note, the Pastoral Relations Commission took steps to amend their handbook to explicitly assert that all persons are welcome into the full life and ministry of the church.

3. How might the Regional Council respond to the issue?

This General Meeting could approve the following draft "Affirming Ministry Statement:"

As an Affirming community, the Canadian Shield Regional Council welcomes and supports lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and two-spirited (LGBTQ+) people in all aspects of the life, work, worship and governance of the church. We believe that all people are children of God; that persons of all ages, races, abilities, and sexual orientations are part of our increasingly diverse culture; and we welcome all persons into the full life and ministry of the church.

We aspire for members of the LGBTQ+ community to find the churches and governing bodies in our Regional Council to be safe places to worship and share gifts.

An increasing number of our churches proudly march in Pride Parades each year behind banners proclaiming who we are. Many of our members are also present at community events in support of the LGBTQ+ community.

The Canadian Shield Regional Council is fully supportive of Affirm United as we strive to continue to be supportive and accepting of all with whom we are in relationship. Please visit their website www.affirmunited.ca to learn more.

Our Regional Council acknowledges that God's love is wider and more inclusive than we can imagine, let alone live out, and we commit ourselves to sharing that news with others who may have heard a quite different message about what it means to be church. Because voices of condemnation, exclusion, and hatred are loud and persistent within the church and in society, we declare that it is important to be a public witness and to be a role model for other ministries. As a Regional Council, we will work persistently, and encourage our communities of faith, to be safe, accessible, inclusive, and affirming.
