#### Support to Ministry Personnel

Students attended for free and one Ministry Personnel had their fee paid by their congregation. There were 22 in attendance, but only a couple of retirees. It was good to have the students present. There was a question about holding the retreat in conjunction with the CSRC AGM. The cost of travel would be a consideration. Millage is paid by the Region for those attending the AGM.





The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting of Executive.

Barb honoured the traditional lands upon which we meet with the following words:

The lands where we gather today, across this region, have been places of gathering for First Nations people as they camped and travelled across the land for generations beyond our knowing. Before people arrived from across the seas, these Nations lived, loved, raised children and made a living. They lived in harmony with all that the Creator had made. As we meet today, we recognize those traditional sojourners in this land. We give thanks for them and for the lands on which we gather today. We acknowledge that our history has come at a great cost to the Indigenous community and we commit ourselves to be partners in healing and reconciliation.

Barb then read the CSRC safe space statement:

The Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive, as an affirming community, is a safe place that welcomes and includes all people to gather and participate in the life and work of the regional council regardless of age, ability, race, cultural background, sexual orientation or gender identity. In this space, all are welcome.

Peter led Executive in a reflection and then he ended with prayer.

#### REGIONAL MEETING UPDATE

Regional Council Reflection, Comments, Thanksgiving, and Learning

Peter gave thanks for everyone who worked on the meeting and especially the tech team.

Nancy gave a brief reflection and stated that the evaluation forms are still coming in and the team will continue to review them. A report to Executive will be forthcoming.

Executive was asked to share their views of the meeting and one point that came up was that there needed to be more volunteers to help with set up and tear down. Also, there needs to be people from the host church on the planning team to help with the local arrangements.

The comment was made that in the future, we need to have hybrid meetings in case people are still uncomfortable meeting in-person due to Covid/Flu and also because of mobility reasons. Several evaluations stated that the online experience was excellent.

Other comments included were that we could/should have taped or made live the discussion groups. Also, it was stated that not having a choir was missed – Bill explained we didn't have one because of Covid protocols and concerns.

There was an indication that people felt that voices were not heard from the floor at all, especially during the GC44 piece. This was an important oversight with the General Secretary present at our meeting, he could have answered many questions directly.

Some people still had Covid anxieties at the meeting. The face-to-face meeting was very important for our region, bridging all the 3 conferences together, as this was only our 2<sup>nd</sup> in-person meeting since becoming a region.

Executive members who attending the campfire at Hannah Lake enjoyed their time.

#### Proposal: Renaming the Regional Council

This decision has been deferred to the next meeting, as members of Executive did not receive the proposal ahead of time.

#### Executive Conversation around Scheduling the Next RCM and Location

Peter indicated that the planning team has not had their final wrap-up meeting and their feedback may have an impact on the scheduling and location. The planning team co-chairs will report back to Executive at the next meeting.

#### REGIONAL MEETING TRAVEL REMUNERATION POLICY

Executive discussed the 2019 and 2022 Regional Meeting Travel Remuneration Policy. Peter indicated it would be beneficial to have a regional policy in place that will not need to be altered at each meeting.

It was suggested that communities of faith should realize that there is a cost to "being church" and travel for their Ministry Personnel, and possibly Regional Reps, will need to be covered by each pastoral charge.

Nancy mentioned that there are two ministry personnel in Sault Ste. Marie are now in "formal association" with communities of faith there. It is understood that the community of faith in which the Ministry Personnel are in Formal Association with will cover the cost of their travel to a regional meeting and maybe that could happen in other places.

#### **EXECUTIVE MINISTER'S REPORT**

Peter discussed one portion of his report – the hiring of a new full-time administrative assistant. The job posting was just put up online today by the General Council Office.

There was consensus that the members of the hiring team for the new administrative staff will be one from each region, plus Peter, with the ability to make hiring decisions.



Business Arising

Retiring Ministers The United Church released Pastoral Relations: Additional Resources for

Retirement earlier this year. Commission members were asked to review this ahead of this meeting. Pastoral Relations: Additional Resources for Retirement (united-church.ca) We held a brief discussion about guidelines concerning the relationship between Communities of Faith and retiring ministers. It was agreed that the PRC does not need its own formal policy at this time. The PRC will recommend that church councils and retiring ministers review this document as retirement approaches. A facilitated conversation may be needed in some situations if issues arise.

#### The United Church of Canada Canadian Shield Regional Council

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Supervisor Reports Elaine Lush and former PRC member Joy Galloway have reviewed the supervisors' reports and Elaine offered to prepare a report for the next Commission Connections meeting so that feedback can be provided to the Support to Communities of Faith Commission (SCofFC) about any issues that need to be addressed.

Sacrament Elder Training

Stewart Walker has approached the Manitou Intentional Learning Community (MILC) and they are willing offer a Sacraments Elder training course in the new year. This would be offered through Zoom and open to anyone but geared to those looking to be a Sacraments Elder for their Community of Faith.

Correspondence

- A letter dated October 18th, 2022 was received from the Zion United Council and the Trout Creek United Official Board. The churches have a shared ministry agreement which states that each church will be responsible to hire their own pulpit supply if the minister is away. Often, they end up hiring the same LLWL because of a shortage of local LLWLs. They are requesting that the PRC consider a proposal that would see anyone hired to do pulpit supply at both churches on the same Sunday would be paid the standard pulpit supply rate plus \$50 (plus milage) rather than the full rate for each service. The following discussion was held:
  - These two Communities of Faith only share a minister and are not a twopoint charge. Do they want to maintain their independence? Is this about the shortage of LLWLs or is this a financial issue?
  - Currently, if an LLWL were to preach at two independent churches in a larger city such as Sudbury or North Bay, they would get paid the full rate for both services. Would this proposal set a precedent where two churches that are geographical close together could reach an agreement to use the same LLWL on a Sunday for a lower cost? Some LLWLs actively seek out opportunities to preach twice on a Sunday.
  - We want to be fair to both LLWLs and churches and it was suggested we should consider the proposal from this letter as a way ease the financial burden on individual churches considering that there is not a lot of extra preparation required to preside at a second service.
  - The policy for hiring LLWLs is different for two-point charges and it was felt that unless we revisit the policy, we cannot make individual exceptions for churches that chose not to become a two-point charge. They cannot consider themselves a two-point charge simply for the purpose of LLWL reimbursement.
  - There was a suggestion that LLWLs might want to consider presiding at two Sunday services if it is practical to do so. This may help ease the shortage of LLWLs in some areas.
  - We agreed by consensus that we are not able to support the proposal from Zion and Trout Creek. Rob Smith and John Watson will draft a response to the churches reiterating our current policy and inviting them to explore becoming a two-point charge in the future to see if this better suits their situation.

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The draft of an Ecumenical Shared Ministry Agreement between St George's Anglican Church, Diocese of Algoma and The United Church of Espanola was received for information.

#### Resource Teams Pastoral Relations Liaisons

There was no report.

- An online check-in for LLWLs is planned for November 19<sup>th</sup>.
- The minimum remuneration for LLWLs will rise by 3.4% to \$182.95 on January 1st, 2023 and the milage rate will rise to \$.55 per kilometer.
- An education event is being organized for February 25th, 2023. Suggestions for a theme would be welcome.

#### Support to Ministry Personnel



Letter to A letter was distributed to the Communities of Faith encouraging people to Communities of Faith consider training to be a Sacraments Elder or an LLWL. So far, several people expressed an interest in these training opportunities. The letter also had a reminder about the increase in the minimum renumeration for LLWLs to \$182.95 and the increase in the travel rate to .05 per kilometer.

Correspondence 

Correspondence was received which outlined the results of the cost-of-living review for Ministry Personnel. A review has not been done for 8 or 9 years instead of the usual 3 years. Minimum salaries across the country are ranked based largely on the cost of housing in any particular area. The review has resulted in recommendations that will be implemented in June 2023. Increases will be capped so that no area will see an increase that is more than one step up the scale (equivalent to about \$3,000 in salary). This could result in some budgeting challenges for some, but it is expected that most Communities of Faith in the CSRC will not feel the effect of this (with the possible exception of the larger urban centers).

#### Appendix I

A letter was received from Kathie Smith, CSRC Chair of Nominations. It was circulated by email to PRC members before this meeting. Now that the new governance structure has been in place for several years, Nominations is requesting that the PRC-related job descriptions (Appendix I) attached to Kathie's letter be reviewed. A brief discussion was held and it was generally agreed that the job descriptions were accurate, but that there was an underestimation of the time commitment. John Watson agreed to respond to Kathie with a more accurate expectation of time including monthly meetings, preparation time and opportunity for involvement with the Commission Connections by three PRC members. Although the current PRC Chair is part of the CSRC Executive, this role could be taken on by any PRC member.

It looks as though one community of faith within the network will apply for a Vision Fund Grant of \$ 5,000.00 to help with the preparation for such a role.

#### Confirmation

The first weekend of May will be a confirmation retreat for both Shining Waters and Canadian Shield RCs. The retreat will be hosted at Sparrow Lake Camp in the Muskoka Region and will be lead by all the ministry personnel whose youth are participating.

## Bees for Peace

Shining Waters received a grant from the Embrace the Spirit Fund to create a curriculum with the University of Toronto organization Bees for Peace. This curriculum will be for Vacation Bible Camps in the upcoming year, and we will be working across both Canadian Shield and Shining Waters with communities of faith and young adults to support the roll out of this program.

#### Young Adult Ministry Grants and Work

There are two young adults who recently received Vision Grants:

One is through Canadian Shield Regional Council, Torrin Maag who is working on Neurodivergence and the Church's relationship with people who are engaging with the church in this way. Torrin also received a grant from Canadian Shield RC.

The second, is through Shining Waters Regional Council, Hopelyn Butler, who is working on a resource for young adults regarding Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity. She will be working with Canadian Shield RC young adults as she develops this curriculum.





## COL Assignments

Rob Smith updated members about the COL review. All treasurers have been informed about the changes that take effect July 1st, 2023. In the past the COL was largely based on housing costs, now other factors such as tax and utility costs will taken into account. 42% of Communities of Faith will have a change to their COL assignment level - 26% moved down the scale and 15% moved up. A drop in the COL level will not mean lower pay for currently employed Ministry Personnel.

## Correspondence

- A document was received regarding the Admission Minister Matching Program Pilot being initiated by the United Church. A discission was held about the program.
  - As part of this pilot, 5 churches will be chosen to place 5 new Admissions Ministry Personnel in full-time positions. Rob Smith has enrolled the CSRC in this program and there are 3 Communities of Faith who may be eligible to take part. This is seen as a way to help ease the shortage of Ministry Personnel, particularly in more isolated regions of the United Church. It is also felt that this may help broaden cultural representation within the United Church.
  - Some concerns were raised by PRC members. This is a replacement for the old settlement program, which didn't always work out. Ultimately, many who were settled moved on to larger centers once the initial placement period wrapped up. Some wondered if we will be creating a 2 tiered-system since this is only for immigrants. There was a question about why some new immigrants may be having trouble getting an interview when there many Communities of Faith without Ministry Personnel.
  - Communities of Faith will need to be ready to help these candidates adapt to living in Canada. Will there be help to lessen the burden of this? Are there tools in place to bridge any gaps with those in the pews who may have reservations about dealing with someone of a different cultural background.
- A card was received from Cory Vermeer-Cuthbert. She offered her thanks for the gift card presented to her upon her retirement from ministry.
- A request was received from St. Andrews, Massey to hire a Congregational Minister including a job description and Living Faith Story. A full discussion of this request was held later in this meeting.

## LLWLs

Rob Smith provided some background information about the Collaborative Ministry Agreement Between Iron Bridge-Bellingham Pastoral Charge, Iron Bridge, ON and Blind River Pastoral Charge, Blind River, ON and Canadian Shield Regional Council of The United Church of Canada (Appendix II).

- There was unanimous agreement when the Ministry Agreement was voted on by both congregations. However, there was significant opposition during the vote at one of the congregations to appoint Rev. Lawrence Muvunzi to the position. Rob was concerned and consulted colleagues at the CSRC about the vote. When the congregation was approached about reconsidering the vote, they informed the PRC that they will allow the result to stand since the UCC threshold of 50% + 1 was met. The cause of the opposition was stated to be the cost involved. There is also some concern that it appears the minister was picked before the Ministry Agreement was finalized.
- There was a mention that perhaps the language around dispute resolution in items 8 and 10 of the Agreement could be reviewed for clarity.
- Both parties to the Agreement will be reminded that all payroll must be handled through one Community of Faith, which will be listed as the employer with ADP.
- Since Rev. Muvunzi has not arrived in Canada yet, all dates in the Ministry Agreement and the appointment motion will be valid for 3 years, adjusted to reflect his arrival date.

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LLWL Fund There was a brief discussion about setting up a fund to help those who may not be able to afford LLWL training in the hope that this may encourage some new applicants. There may be some funding available through a program at St. Paul's United, Thunder Bay. It was suggested that a bulletin insert be prepared to promote LLWL training and that perhaps there should be follow-up contact with church councils across CSRC. Rob Smith will talk about this further with the LLWL Resource Team

Covenanting Service There have been questions about what happens to the offering collected during Offering CSRC covenanting services. The PRC currently has no policy around this. Under the old church structure, Presbyteries oversaw these events and the money usually went to support ministry education. It was agreed that the Liaisons should work with the Communities of Faith to decide where offering money should be directed, but that organizers should be encouraged to consider options that promote ministry education. There is nothing to prevent donations towards any charity of the congregation's choosing.

## Congregational Designated Appendix III

Minister St. Andrew's United, Massey ON has requested approval to hire a Congregational Designated Minister (CDM) to provide pastoral care on a part-time basis. The proposed job description (Appendix III) was circulated to PRC members by email for review before this meeting.

- There are some possible applicants for the position who are currently LLWLs but there were questions raised about how candidates will be evaluated with regard to their pastoral care skills. What kind of background, training or work experience will be considered.
- It was suggested that a vulnerable police records check should be a requirement. The CDM would be accountable to the congregation which currently is operating with a Pastoral Charge Supervisor. The PCS has offered support for this.
- What are the expectations around pastoral care training? Most of the work will be done over the phone, but where is the line between providing pastoral care and visiting. Concerns were also raised about eroding the ministerial role in this area without clear boundaries in place.
- Catherine Somerville has been working with the congregation on this and she will talk further with them about some of concerns that were raised. She will also endeavour to make contact with another congregation who has already hired a CDM. It was felt that since this is a new concept for CSRC, that we need to explore the possibilities before committing to approve this request.

## Other Business

Administration Donna Rutz who provides Administrative Support to Shining Waters Regional Support Council will now be tasked with providing additional support to our Region.



Most agreed that the person who is hired would be accountable to the congregation and would be covered under the same liability insurance as other employees of the United Church.

David Colwell Rob Smith provided some background information about the change of pastoral relations of David Colwell with Pinegrove United (Rosslyn ON) and Trinity United (Thunder Bay ON).

- David's employment with these two congregations was terminated without notice by the Office of Vocation after his Supervised Ministry Experience (SME) and his Candidacy was terminated by his Candidacy Board. There are a number of questions about how this situation was handled since the congregation has been left paying for his 90-day notice period even though the decision about his employment was out of there hands. As well, the PRC was only informed about this after the fact. There was a lack of respect for all those involved and it is felt by many that the Office of Vocation and the Candidacy Board overstepped in this situation.
- This is an unfortunate situation. The Candidacy Board was not happy with his progress as a ministerial student. However, under the new structure of the United Church, congregations are supposed to have more autonomy about who they hire. In this case the churches were informed about his termination by Zoom without being given an opportunity to be part of the decision.
- David is due 90-day severance (the standard for ministerial appointments) but the Office of Vocation has said it has no money to pay, leaving this expense to be borne by the two congregations. Not paying it would likely mean a challenge at the Labour Board. It is easier to pay since there is no guarantee of a Labour Board ruling that is favourable for the Church.

- Rob Smith will write the letter to the Office of Vocation with help from John Watson and Catherine Somerville to explain our concerns and request a change in how theses situations are handled in the future.

- <u>Affirming Ministry Resource Team:</u> This team met March 23<sup>rd</sup>. Plan a May 10<sup>th</sup> Town Hall with Affirming congregations,. The PIE Day workshop with Shining Waters was excellent.
- Youth & Young Adult Ministry Resource Team: Sudbury has several Regional Youth events as well as a Regional Confirmation group that will share a retreat with Shining Waters in May.
- <u>United in Worship Project:</u> There are 3 new writers supporting this project: Whitney Bruno, Melody Duncanson Hales, Brenna Baker with Justin Coutts indicating that he is interested. George and Jim will meet to finish off the request for help and a summary of the project.
- Social Justice Network: The network is following up with the Ontario regional councils to ensure the assessments are paid. There will be a meeting in May. The Guaranteed Liveable Income network saw a vigil at St Andrew's UC Larch Street Sudbury led by Torrin Maag and an action in front of Right Honorable Patti Haidu constituency office.

## **Emergent Business:**

 Thunder Bay Stewardship event: April 22, 23<sup>rd</sup> with staff members sharing worship, digging into conversations providing resources.

Moved: Mardi Mumford Seconded: Peter Haddow That the Commission for the Support to Communities of Faith approve the expenditures of funds from the Network and Cluster fund for hospitality at the Thunder Bay Stewardship event.

## Carried with Ernie Epp abstaining.

• Rural Connect: There is a need to engage in the wider region for a deeper understanding on how Rural Connect works. This commission is seeing many church closures with no clear ability to support continued worship in these communities. Rural Connect is a way to facilitate worship and connection. How are we using the proceeds from the sale of church property to support these small communities of faith? George Bott, Jim Jackson, Melody Duncanson Hales and Diane Matheson Jimenez will put together a proposal to take to the Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive to look at how the proceeds from sale of property which is held at the Region level can support new initiatives including Rural Connect. As well there is a need to create a Legal Fund to support these sales.

In 2022, at General Council 44, the National Indigenous Council proposed that the church identify and remove any structural barriers that would prevent the development and sustaining of an autonomous National Indigenous Organization within The United Church of Canada. When any requested change in church structure will alter the Basis of Union of *The Manual*, as this will, a Category 3 Remit is required.

<u>This remit</u> (opens in a new tab) asks if the church will agree to remove these structural barriers so that the Indigenous Church can determine its place and structure within the United Church. The 44th General Council authorized this remit to test the will of the church with respect to this change.


Approval of this remit will enable the creation of an autonomous National Indigenous Organization within The United Church of Canada. This would acknowledge Indigenous

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peoples' rights to their own spiritual identities and to self-determination, and would be consistent with the Caretakers of our Indigenous Circle's *Calls to the Church* and the <u>United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples</u>.

The remit requires a vote by every regional council and each pastoral charge's governing body. Information about the remit, as well as voting cards, were sent to every regional council and each pastoral charge on March 10, either through email or Canada Post. Voting will take place between March 15, 2023, and March 31, 2024. Abstentions are considered a vote against the remit.

Barb introduced Nicole to Executive and invited her to open discussions about the Memorandum of Agreement between Huntington University, The United Church of Canada, and the Canadian Shield Regional Council. Nicole shared that this agreement is the third one to cross her desk and the drafted agreement is typical of this kind of relationship. She indicated that the agreement can be rescinded with a 6-month written notice if we decide to terminate the agreement.

 Peter stated that we will be discussing Remit #1 later on in the agenda and Executive decided to wait to have the discussion.

#### CS RCM PLANNING TEAM POLICY DRAFT DOCUMENT

Executive reviewed and edited the Canadian Shield Regional Council Meeting Team Draft Policy, which was created from our learnings after our last in-person RCM in Sudbury, as well as our past experiences with conference and regional meetings.

#### SIGNING AUTHORITIES REVISITED

Peter revisited the changes in staff that has and is occurring in the region and the need to change the signing authorities.

MOTION by John Watson/Nancy Ferguson 2023-04-12/13-05 That the signing officers for all Bank Accounts at the Bank of Montreal and BMO Nesbitt Burns for the Canadian Shield Regional Council be Susan Whitehead, Janet MacDonald, Kathleen Wolfe and Kathleen Smith, effective June 1, 2023. CARRIED

#### NOMINATIONS REPORT

The Chair of Nominations, Kathie Smith, shared the nominations report with Executive. There were several positions posted in January and the team is still working on getting those positions filled. Each Resource Team and Commission are sending in updated job descriptions to Nominations and will be put up on the website as soon as they are received.

Executive discussed the list of terms for this body and Kathie indicated that everyone should now be on a 3-year term, with the end dates being staggered. For those Executive members whose term is up in 2023 (Stewart Walker, Dave LeGrand, Joy Galloway, Helen Smith and Eun-Joo because she is leaving to take a position with the SWRC), they could choose to stay for a second term.

#### FESTIVAL OF FAITH (FoF) UPDATE

Susan shared that there are currently sitting at 51 registrants and about 4 of those are from Shining Waters RC and that the planning team has a meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>, where they will discuss how to increase the promotion of the FoF. The planning team just learned that James Ko's Admission to The United Church of Canada will be at the Sunday service of the FoF. A reminder message will go out to the region with that information.

## REMIT #1 VOTE - ESTABLISHING AN AUTONOMOUS NATIONAL INDEIGENOUS ORGANIZATION

Peter indicated that there are two ways the region can move with the remit; the first is to discuss this at the Regional Council Meeting to serve as an education function for communities of faith and then remind the church boards/councils to vote; the second is to have a vote at the Executive level. Executive had a discussion about which way would be most beneficial to communities of faith and it was decided that there will be an educational component at the RCM and that perhaps a Town Hall Meeting will happen within a month of the due date of the vote (February 2024).

#### **EXECUTIVE MINISTER'S REPORT**

Executive received the Executive Minister Report, for information (attached as Appendix A).

#### Update on UCC Budget

Peter attended a staff leader's meeting on Tuesday afternoon where Erik Mathiesen reported about the budget for The United Church of Canada. The UCC needs to make a cut to their budget of \$6 million. Discussions at the General Council Office have occurred questioning the number of regions in The UCC, if we could decrease some of them and what would that look like.

#### Conversations About Relationship Between CS and SW

Peter led a discussion with Executive about the relationship between SW and CS to date and how we have been sharing staff, events, budgets, etc. He expressed sadness around the number of pastoral charges they have closed in the last 2-3 years. Peter indicated that this was a preliminary discussion about our relationship and future partnering and for Executive to think about it.

Peter closed the meeting and Executive sang, VU 289 "It Only Takes a Spark."

Thursday, April 13, 2023 - 9:00 a.m.

#### **OPENING PRAYER**

Barb opened the meeting and Peter started off by acknowledging Volunteer Appreciation Week and thanked all Executive members for all their hard work they do for the region that is deeply appreciated. Peter led Executive in a brief worship by singing Voices United 356 "Seek Ye First the Kingdom" and then shared a prayer.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) WITH SWRC

Executive reviewed the MOU between SW and CS regional councils. There were minor clerical changes and a larger change to #10. Executive acknowledged that this term in the MOU has not been met and would like to honour it going forward, expressing the need to have both the Executives of SW and CS Regional Councils to meet face-to-face soon. It was determined that the ad hoc committee could be the Chair and Chair Elect of the CS Executive, the President and President Elect of the SW Executive (the Past Chair/President if no Chair/President Elect is present), plus the Executive Minister, his assistant, the Staff Lead from SW and other staff, as needed. The wording for #10 will be rewritten to reflect that this group will jointly decide the dates of the Regional Council Meetings for both regional councils, with input from the Executives.

#### SEPTEMBER 2023 JOINT EXECUTIVE ZOOM MEETING BETWEEN CS AND SW

Executive discussed the possibility of meeting at Villa Loyola in September 2023 for a joint CS and SW Executive meeting. Executive instructed Peter to ask the SW Executive if this is a possibility for them.

#### **SCoFC PROPOSAL PRESENATION**

The Chair welcomed Mardi Mumford and Melody Duncanson-Hales to the meeting where they shared a presentation on behalf of the Support to Communities of Faith Commission (*Appendix B*).

MOTION by Bill Steadman/Nancy Ferguson 2023-04-12/13-06 That the Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive support, in principle, the Mustard Seed Strategy proposal of the Support to Communities of Faith Commission and to create policy that reflects that proposal.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

David shared that members at St. Andrew's UC in Sudbury had a robust discussion about the Manitou Art Collection and they wondered if there was a digital copy of all the pictures in the collection. The suggestion was to contact the Right Relations Resource Team (RRRT) to inquire if the region can have access to these images (possibly with a CSRC watermark on each image). Susan has some of the images digitized after the Conference Office fire. The request for digital images of the collection will be forwarded to the RRRT for action.

## Appendix A Executive Minister Report March 2023

Happy Spring!!! The planning team for the Festival of Faith is well organized and has made significant progress. Staff visited the venue site. Shining Waters Regional Council has chatted with Canadian Shield Regional Council, through Barb this past month, around a learning event and we will need to begin thinking about partnering for 2025. Both Regional Council Executives seem very excited.

We posted the new full-time admin. position to be shared between the Canadian Shield and Shining Waters Regional Councils. The position was posted in January for two weeks. We also circulated via Regional networks, hiring platforms etc. The General Council supports hiring for Regional Councils through its HR office. They received many applicants and a three-person hiring team was created with myself, Jody Maltby and Joy Galloway. We did interviews in early February. We hired Kathleen Wolfe and she started mid-March. You can reach Kathleen at Email:

<u>kwolfe@united-church.ca</u>. Kathleen provides primary administrative support for Shining Waters and Canadian Shield Regional Councils. Rachael retires May 2023, we will be very sad to say goodbye. Susan will move as primary Executive Minister admin. support for both Regional Councils. Presently Susan just supports Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive.

We are currently in the position of hiring a new Congregational Support Minister for SWRC, who's primary work will focus South of the 407 in Shining Waters Regional Council. The successful applicant is Eun-Joo Park! We are delighted for Eun-Joo and SWRC; however, CSRC will deeply miss her leadership and this change will also create a vacancy for CSRC at our Executive.

Recently at our Executive Minister Management Meeting, Erik Matheson, CFO for the United Church shared that the General Council (GC) needs to cut our GC operating budget by 6 million dollars over two years. He also feels that communities of faith do not have the capacity to increase General Council assessments. One of the acute challenges at this time for General Council is both the challenge of inflation and at the same time, receiving smaller returns on investment. While the Regional Council operating grant will remain the same until 2025, M&S Grants to the Regional Council will likely be cut in 2024/25, which could have an impact on our operating income. The cut will also have an impact on granting.

In the near future, we have pre-planned some room for cuts to our income. However, my sense is in the future, we will face cuts to our operating budget, while at the same time our expenses will increase. Part of the way we are addressing this future challenge is by partnering more and more with Shining Waters around staffing and budgeting related to staffing. However, my suggestion to both Regional Councils is to start talking about how we can partner more as two Regional Councils. Erik Matheson at our recent meeting, raised the delicate point that he has concerns around the economic sustainability of 16 Regional Councils. Frankly for many, it went over like a lead balloon. For me, I am mindful that he has the challenging task of being the messenger and not the author of our economic challenge.

My sense is we could approach this future challenge in two ways. One we could wait and deal with the challenge when we need to face it head-on, which is a legitimate strategy, since the Regional Council would likely be more accepting facing a budget challenge in real time. The second option would be to intentionally reach out to Shining Waters Regional Council about partnering more beyond staff. Perhaps experiment with ways we could consolidate our administrative work as a Regional Council. Consider how we could partner around Regional Council Meetings and at the very least, consider how we are distinctive as a Regional Council and consider what work we are we doing that is essentially the same? I am aware the Canadian Shield Regional Council is new and folks are new to each other. My sense, after discussing this with Chair Barb, is that we need to proceed carefully and thoughtfully as we work toward creating a strong community in CSRC. However, as our Regional Council policy already has a mechanism for partnering, I am recommending that we work towards planning a joint Executive Meeting with CSRC and SWRC in the fall to brain storm how we can strengthen our partnership and perhaps consider how we can work together. If we can figure out a path forward together, perhaps we can offer leadership to the entire church, as we face our future challenges together. We could also provide leadership to our communities of faith as they face similar challenges and conversations with neighbouring United Churches.

Appendix B

The Mustard Seed Strategy
Submitted by the Support to Communities of Faith Commission

"...for truly I say to you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you." ~Matthew 17:20 "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert" ~Isaiah 43:19

Canadian Shield is a Regional Council that has faith that moves mountains. In the face of decline – in membership, financial and human resources, and aging church buildings – members of Canadian Shield are working together to creatively discern and respond to God's will for the church in this time. And while we, with deep regret, as a Commission of the Regional Council disband communities of faith with regularity, we also live in trust that the small seeds our congregations have planted will take deep root and become a resting place for fresh expressions of the Holy Spirit at work in Northern Ontario.

We are blessed with abundance in Canadian Shield! We have access to funds that allow us to support educational initiatives, ministry with youth, community outreach, outdoor ministries, and much more. It is a privilege we do not take lightly to be able to share these monies with communities of faith and individuals who are doing and being church in innovative ways. We have also found that restricted funds, and funds with very specific foci, have kept us from responding in a timely and nimble way when communities of faith recognize a need, or discern a call, and wish for the Regional Council to partner in doing a new thing.

To this end, we are proposing the adoption of the Mustard Seed Strategy. Our vision is that the \$100 000 communities of faith support fund established by CSRC Executive motion 2022-12-01-12 (MOTION by John Watson/Jim Jackson That the CSRC Executive, after receiving the motion from the Finance Resource Team, it was decided to put \$100,000 in a fund designated for communities of faith support. CARRIED) will be administered by the Support to Communities of Faith Commission and renewed in perpetuity, seeded from property sales and redevelopment to a maximum of \$25 000 per year. Of the \$25 000 per annum, we would like to see \$5 000 designated for the work of the Support to Communities of Faith Commission – travel for an inperson meeting if appropriate, facilitation or a retreat opportunity to enable us to do our work more faithfully, or supplies we may need. The remaining \$20 000 we would like to be able to grant to communities of faith to facilitate growth. Examples may include, but not be limited to, purchasing technology (such as that made available through Rural Connect) to enable collaboration, organizing community hubs, and providing hospitality.

We live in hope that we might soon see an end to the need to disband communities of faith. As congregations turn to one another in collaboration and amalgamation, we would invite members of the Executive into a time of discernment with the Support to Communities of Faith Commission. It has been our practice, in Canadian Shield, not to declare surplus property when communities of faith amalgamate. In order that we might better support all congregations in the Regional Council, we would like to discuss the possibility of revisiting this policy. We would welcome the opportunity for a joint Executive and Support to Communities of Faith Commission Zoom call where we might build community, pray together, and discern how we can partner together to witness the new things God is up to in our Regional Council.

This fund will help the Support to Communities of Faith commission on behalf of the Regional Council, help communities of faith in Canadian Shield to live out our shared call to deep spirituality, bold discipleship and daring justice.

4. We want the Executive to commit to replenishing this fund for up to \$25,000.00 per year using a percentage from the proceeds of sale of properties.

Presently proceeds from the sale of properties are as follows: 3% Archive support, 10% Indigenous Church, 10% M & S, 30% for legacy of closing church, 47% to the Region with some input from the congregation on allotment to some of the existing funds such as Camp Fund

5. Procedural piece: The Commission for the Support to Communities of Faith will manage the fund with a specific paper trail to request Finance to release funds. For large sums, there will be an application form to detail the specifics.



DCM Request A revised job description for the Congregational Designated Minister (CDM) at St. Andrew's United (Massey ON) was circulated by email before this meeting. There was a brief discussion before presenting a motion for approval:

- Catherine Somerville provided a completed Position Categorization Worksheet which was used to help finalize the job description (Found in the Pastoral Relations: Congregational Designated Ministers manual from March 2020.) Congregational Designated Ministers (March 2020) (united-church.ca)
- It was recognized that a lot of work has gone into this job description. Thanks to Catherine for her work with the St. Andrew's Community of Faith.
- A more general discussion about DCMs was held later in this meeting.

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#### Motion 2023-04-26-03

Catherine Sommerville/ Elaine Lush moved that the request from St. Andrew's United (Massey ON) to hire a Congregational Designated Minister be approved based on the revised job description (Appendix I).

Letter to Office As discussed at our last meeting, a letter has not yet been sent to the Office of of Vocation Vacation concerning the termination of David Colwell following the ending of Supervised Ministry Experience (SME).

Pastoral Charge Only 5 Pastoral Charge Supervisor reports have been received so far. Rob Smith Supervisors will request that Sue Whitehead send out a reminder letter. Joy Galloway and Elaine Lush will meet to review the reports that have been received.

Admissions There are 5 Ministry Personnel waiting for placement through the Admissions Pilot Pilot Project. No churches in this region have expressed an interest in hiring through this project.

#### Correspondence

The following items of correspondence were received:

- A letter dated April 17th, 2023 was received from Rev. John Fraser on behalf of the Council of St. James-in-the-Valley United, Val Therese ON. The letter outlines the experiences of Student Minister David Chuipka, who has resigned his position. The congregation feels that David left due to a lack of support as he faced some personnel issues while trying to meet the obligations of his SME. To date, David has not formally requested to give up his candidacy and has not met with the Candidacy Board. It appears there has not been communication with the Office of Vocation or the Atlantic School of Theology. There is little the PRC can do at the moment to influence this situation and the Community of Faith is still considered a learning site. The congregation seems to have genuine concern for David's well-being. Perhaps there has been some blurring of the line between his role as a minister and his obligations as a student, which should always come first.
- A letter was received Susan Boisvert on behalf of the Search Committee of Covenant United, Timmins ON which outlines the frustrating experience of hiring a new minister. There is not likely anything the PRC can do in the short term, however is good to have these issues highlighted in writing. Rob will discuss some of these ideas with the Liaisons. Susan's letter mentioned problems using ChurchHub and perhaps there needs to be more awareness of support options that are available through the United Church. The experience of Covenant United is not likely unique as many churches are taking up to 2 years to find a minister.

#### New Business

#### Resource Teams Pastoral Relations Liaisons

- There was no report from the Liaison Resource Team as they have not met.
- There has been a request to update the Pulpit Supply Policy concerning reimbursement when an LLWL provides a sermon and worship outline but is unable to attend the service because of extenuating circumstances. Preparation

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is the biggest part of the job for an LLWL and there should be encouragement to pay compensation (less any milage) when last part of the task cannot be completed. This will also help maintain a positive relationship between the congregation and the LLWL. Rob Smith will consult with the LLWL Resource Team and will draft an addition to the policy for the next PRC meeting.

Relicensing for another group of LLWLs is ongoing.

#### Support to Ministry Personnel

## Designated Ministers

Congregational A discussion was held about the role of the Congregational Designated Ministers within the Canadian Shield Region.

- Currently there are churches within our Region without Ministry Personnel who are employing the same person for pulpit supply almost every week. Some have Sacraments Elder or LLWL training. Some have no background in the United Church. Over time some of these people are being thought of as 'the minister' by the members of the Community of Faith and this is causing unease for some people.
- Issues include the question of who is the de facto minister accountable to and is this practice devaluing the role of trained ordained Ministry Personnel and DLMs. People who are in these positions may lack an understanding of church policy, ethos or theology. There may not be a police record check done. Would accepting them as CDMs be a good idea in order to provide at least some oversight? Would this work in isolated communities? Perhaps making such an

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- appointment would be a way of recognizing that some congregations will not be able to attract a minister because of money or isolation issues.
- Should CDMs be considered as support for Ministry Personnel and DLMs or can we endorse a CDM as the minister for a congregation? This brings up the question of what it means to be a minister. Should we revisit the one order of ministry concept and the role of DLMs (which remains somewhat murky since the failure of the one order remit)?
- Shining Waters Regional Council is watching how our Region handles this situation as they have churches in the large urban areas that cannot afford to hire a minister because of cost-of-living issues and housing shortages (and most churches no longer have manses).
- As there are 44 out of 78 Communities of Faith in our Region that are not served by Ministry Personnel, this will be an ongoing discussion.

#### Resource Teams Pastoral Relations Liaisons

- There was no report from the Liaison Resource Team as they have not met.
- The relicensing of LLWLs is ongoing, however there are still 16 LLWLs in the current group whose licenses will expire in June and many of these have not yet completed the required paperwork. Some of these LLWLs have questioned the need to be relicensed every 3 years.
- It is known that there are currently former LLWLs who let their licenses lapse and still continue to preach regularly. Technically, congregations can hire whoever they wish to preach and non-licensed people can preach up to 4 times a year under PRC policy. Some LLWLs are saying what is the point of licensing?
- It is difficult to enforce the licensing when there appears to be few consequences if unlicensed people are preaching. Are congregations aware of the risk in hiring non-licensed or non-UCC recognized people? If there are problems, the United Church would not be available to offer support. Perhaps there should be some education about this.
- There is a shortage of LLWLs and this may lead to congregations hiring unlicensed people in order to fill their pulpit.
- Ted Harrison spoke about the success of the in-person training that was offered in the former Manitou Conference. Perhaps this is a way to increase the interest and awareness of the role of LLWLs. Ted offered to speak with Kathleen McCallum (who lead this program for Manitou) to see if she may be interested in leading some in-person training again. CSRC does have a good onlinetraining program and perhaps a hybrid training version could be developed if there is interest.

#### Support to Ministry Personnel

- There are currently no events planned.
- Plans for the Moderator to attend a Ministry Personnel retreat in the Region in 2024 have changed. She will attend the May 2024 general meeting.
- An evaluation/questionnaire will be sent out to Ministry Personnel in the Region to help determine what kind of events are needed/wanted and how best to provide support.

#### **Growth Animator Position Description:**

Background: Cam Fraser has been hired as the Growth Co-ordinator (Director of Growth and Ministry Development). The Animator will be imbedded in the region and shared between Shining Waters Regional Council and Canadian Shield Regional Council. Reporting of activities, would be to the Commission for the Support to Communities of Faith.

The division of responsibility would be 45% renewing existing communities of faith, 45% seeding new communities of faith and 10% Learning, Adapting, Innovating and Inviting. This position would be divided with 50% Canadian Shield Regional Council and 50% Shining Waters Regional Council.

#### Response:

- Need that there will be opportunities once we work with this model to be flexible around the percentages
- The position will need a deep appreciation of our rural context in Northern Ontario
- The commission needs to be involved as this evolves; communication with the Commission for the Support to Communities of Faith needs to be clear
- The implication around evangelicalism **needs** to start with the people in the pews before we can expect to reach out.
- This is a big job filled with hope.
- There is a real need to reach out to lay led congregations and this will be hard in the rural structure and this position will need a good strategy to communicate with these small, lay led congregations.



Happy Spring!!! The Joint Executive Ad Hoc Committee of Canadian Shield Regional Council and Shining Waters Regional Council met on May 2, 2023. The group included Chair Barb and President David, Chair Elect Nancy and President Elect Tina. The conversation focused on our relationship between Regional Councils, planning between both regions, and a discussion about the 2025 Festival of Faith.

The Ad Hoc Committee discussed the upcoming joint Executive meeting between the two regional Executives, including making the meeting a 1- or 2-night stay. The decision was made to drive up to Sudbury to the Villa Loyola retreat centre in the afternoon of Tuesday, September 26th, 2023 to get there for a dinner time start, stay for 2 nights, and return home in the afternoon on Thursday, September 28th. We have sent emails to both Executives with this information and Susan has confirmed the dates and times with Villa Loyola. David shared that he was very thankful that the CS Executive invited the SW Executive to come up to share a joint meeting in September and feels it will be very beneficial to both regions. SW and CS Executives will work jointly on the agenda for the meeting.

The Ad Hoc Committee discussed the in-person dates for both Regional Council Meetings (RCMs) in 2024. After an extensive search through dates that would work for both SW and CS, and didn't interfere with holidays or special days within the UCC, it was decided that the SW in-person RCM for 2024 would be the weekend of June 7, 8, 9 and the CS in-person RCM for 2024 would be May 3, 4, 5, in partnership and working around the Moderator's Flourishing Event on May 1-4. We have corresponded with the Flourishing Event planning committee to let them know we plan to work around the event to host our 2024 Regional meeting. This will consolidate travel and facilitate travel support. The suggested location given to the Moderator's Planning Committee is Sault Ste Marie, a central location for both events.

#### FESTIVAL OF FAITH 2023 and 2025:

The 2023 Festival of Faith planning is going very well. The planning committee and local arrangement are well organized and we look forward to wonderful event! Presently, 102 people have registered.

The Joint Ad Hoc Committee started conversation around the joint Festival of Faith in 2025 and the team looked at possible calendar dates in 2025. I shared with the committee that the Moderator's Planning Committee asked Regional Councils to consider partner events for their official visit. The Moderator-lead Flourishing Event will not be considered our official visit. The Ad Hoc Committee decided to reach out to the Moderator's Advisory Committee to see if she would consider participating in a Festival of Faith event tentatively set for June 13-15, 2025.

### UPCOMING MODERATOR'S FOURISH VISITS, hosted by the Moderator:

As previously mentioned, the CS Moderator's Flourish visit will be May 1-4, 2024. Peter will inquire if we can share that visit with the CS RCM. Location still TBD, but suggested location Sault Ste. Marie.

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### 2023 REGIONAL MEETING NOVEMBER, BUDGET AND STAFFING:

Janet continues planning for the 2024 budget and planning for the online Regional Council Meeting will not likely start until mid to late summer or first thing in the fall.

We say goodbye to Rachael Howes as of May 31, 2023. I have deeply appreciated her work, sense of humor and great skill over the past 5 years. It has been an honour to work with her. We hired a new Congregational Support Minister for SWRC, whose primary work will focus south of the 407 in Shining Waters Regional Council. The successful applicant is Eun-Joo Park! We are delighted for Eun-Joo and SWRC. Currently, she is serving is the Canadian Shield Regional Council and the minister at St. Andrew's United Church in Sault Ste. Marie. She will start August 1, 2023.

Recently at our Executive Minister management meeting, Erik Mathiesen the CFO for the United Church, shared that the General Council needs to cut our GC operating budget by 6 million dollars over two years. He also feels that communities of faith do not have the capacity to increase General Council assessments. One of the acute challenges at this time for General Council is both the challenge of inflation and receiving smaller returns on investment. While the Regional Council operating grant will remain the same until 2025, M&S Grants to Regional Council will likely be cut in 2024/25, which could have an impact on our operating income. The cut will also have an impact on granting.

In the near future, we have pre-planned some room for cuts to our income. However, my sense is in the future, we will face cuts to our operating budget while at the same time our expenses will increase. Part of the way we are addressing this future challenge is by partnering more and more around staffing and budgeting related to staffing. However, my suggestion to both Regional Councils is to start talking about how we can partner more as two regional councils. Erik Mathiesen raised the delicate point that he has concerns around the economic sustainability of 16 Regional Councils. For me, I am mindful that he has the challenging task of being the messenger and not the author of our economic challenge.

My sense is we could approach this future challenge in two ways: one, we could wait and deal with the challenge when we need to face it head-on, which is a legitimate strategy, as the Regional Council would likely be more accepting facing a budget challenge in real time; and two, would be to intentionally reach out to the Canadian Shield Regional Council about partnering more beyond staff. Perhaps experiment with ways we could consolidate our administrative work as a Regional Council; consider how we could partner around RCMs and at the very least, consider how we are distinctive as a Regional Council and consider what work are we doing that is essentially the same. My sense discussing with President David from SWRC is that we need to proceed carefully and thoughtfully, as we work toward creating a strong community between the two Regional Councils. However, as our Regional Council policy already has a mechanism for partnering, I am recommending that we work at the joint Executive meeting this fall to brainstorm how we can strengthen our partnership and perhaps, consider how we can work together. If we can figure out a path forward together, perhaps we can offer leadership to the entire church as we face our future challenges together. We could also provide leadership to our communities of faith as they face similar challenges and conversations with neighbouring United Churches.



- What needs to be done regarding finances treasurer leaving & government regulations?

Janet was able to provide the following information. Camp McDougall charitable statues is a concern. The youth leaders have not been paid properly through payroll although have been receiving advances. Bank Accounts have not been reconciled. At this time Janet does not know how long it will take to complete what is being asked of her.

Camp McDougall Annual Meeting is scheduled for November 2023 following which the Executive is requesting a financial report. In the case that \$5,000 will not be enough to allow Janet to complete the work requested another motion will be put in place.



Letter to Office The letter to the Office of Vacation concerning the termination of David Colwell of Vocation following the ending of Supervised Ministry Experience (SME) has not yet been

sent. Rob Smith will make this a priority before the next meeting.

Pastoral Charge Elain Lush has summarized reports from 13 Pastoral Charge Supervisors Supervisor Reports representing a number of Communities of Faith. Her report was emailed to PRC

members to review. There are several items that will need some follow-up including several congregations that are questioning their longer-term

sustainability. We will discuss how we can help at our next meeting. Rob Smith will forward a copy of the report to the Support to Communities of Faith Commission (SCofFC) as some of these issues fall under their purview. It was noted the joint committee of the PRC and (SCofFC) has not met recently. It is

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important that we commit to following up as a way of recognizing the work of the Supervisors. Rob offered thanks to Elaine for her work on putting this report together.

Pulpit Supply The Pulpit Supply Policy still needs to be updated, including how to handle the issue of compensation when a congregation uses material prepared by an LLWL who is not able to attend worship due to unforeseen circumstances. It was suggested that perhaps partial compensation could be offered.

LLWL In-person There was an update regarding in-person LLWL training.

- Training There has been a good response with 15 or 16 people expressing interest. Kathleen McCallum will lead a training session for the first component of the training at Villa Loyola in Sudbury November 17-19. It will likely be a hybrid session since there are 3 people from Thunder Bay who are interested, but travelling to Sudbury would be difficult. The plan is to hold 1 in-person session and two online sessions to complete the course.
  - Each session will cost participants \$300 not including lodging and food. The full budget for the event is not known yet. Rob will have numbers at our next meeting. It was agreed that additional funding to help with the cost of the facilities and food should come from the United in Learning Fund which has money available for LLWL training events.
  - Online registration will open soon.

#### Motion 2023-09-26-04

Ted Harrison/ Joy Bott moved that the Pastoral Relation Commission approve the offering of a hybrid LLWL training event, with the first of four modules to be held at Villa Loyola in Sudbury on November 17-19, 2023. Participants will each pay \$300 per module with additional funding being made available through the United in Learning Fund pending finalization of the budget.

Benevolent Fund The vote on this motion was first presented for an email vote on July 6th, 2023, but the vote was postponed by consensus. It was noted we have had two requests for financial help this year.

#### Motion 2023-09-26-05

The fund would be jointly administered by the Pastoral Relations Minister and the Chair of the Pastoral Relations Commission. LLWL License There are 4 LLWLs that have not applied to have their licenses renewed despite Non-Renewal efforts to contact them. Rob Smith will send out a letter informing Communities of Faith that they are no longer licensed as Lay Worship Leaders by the CSRC. Rob will also ensure that the Pulpit Supply List is updated.

A letter from General Secretary Michael Blair was circulated to PRC members by email containing information regarding the United Church's cost of living (COLA) calculations. There will be a 6.3% increase in 2024 under the previous CSRC Pastoral Relations Commission Meeting Held by Zoom September 26th, 2023

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- policy, but beginning in 2025 the GC Executive has decided to delink the annual decisions from the Consumer Price Index (CPI) while striving to compensate paid accountable personnel as fairly as possible.
- Several GCE proposals to eliminate functional distinctions between Designated Lay Ministers and Ordered Ministry were all carried and will be presented to the GC meeting in October. Regional Councils will be urged to review their polices for DLMs and retired DLMs with the goal of bringing consistency across the country.

Consensus Packet The Consensus Packet was circulated by email for review before the meeting. It was noted that the PRC was being asked to approve several calls in the consensus motion retroactively. A discussion was held about this practice, as this is not the first time this has happened.

- The question was raised of how important PRC approval is if it happens after the effective appointment date given that Communities of Faith can ultimately hire whoever they want. Are we just a rubber stamp? It was stated that it is important for the PRC to review calls and appointments to ensure that all the correct term are in place, otherwise what is the point of our approval?
- The Office of Vocation ultimately approves all candidates and it operates on a complaint driven system. Complaints must be written for action to be taken. The PRC is responsible to ensure that all the technical steps are taken before an appointment is finalized.
- In the past, Presbyteries had to approve all appointments and under the new UC structure this falls to the Regional Councils. There have always been the occasional retroactive approvals, but we should be more diligent about avoiding this situation in the future.

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- One big reason we end up in this situation is because there appears to be a disconnect between the Regional Council and Communities of Faith. Once the decision has been made to hire, congregations and candidates are often in a hurry to start the appointment and they do not want to wait for the next PRC meeting. This is especially noticeable after our summer break. There should be more education about the process of hiring and firing with involvement of the Liaisons and CSRC Representatives.
- We are doing a disservice if we continue allowing appointments to start before PRC approval. It was agreed that going forward, we will try to ensure that appointments are not approved retroactively. This will improve accountability and transparency. Practically, this will likely mean that if congregations decide to hire someone over the summer, PRC approval will not happen before our September meeting (meaning an appointment will likely take effect around October 1st).

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



#### DISCUSSION RE: FORMAL POLICY AND TERMS FOR LOANS FROM THE CSRC

A potential policy regarding loans from the Canadian Shield was discussed, leading to the formation of a working group consisting of members from the Finance Committee, the Grants Committee, and Staff. A process for handling financial requests and approvals was discussed, with Bill suggesting that the responsible group should make recommendations, and Jim proposing a hierarchy for approvals. The role of the Executive was also discussed, with Peter highlighting that the current policy allows the Executive to approve up to \$5,000.

### **REGIONAL MEETING 2023 AND 2024**

Planning Team Notes for 2023 and Updates for 2023 RCM

Barb shared that there was a planning meeting to discuss the 2023 online RCM. The planning team consists of Barb, Peter, Diane and Susan; it was decided since this was a smaller, online meeting that a full planning team was not needed. Agenda includes the remit vote, proposals (if any), approval of the 2024 Draft Budget, Nominations and the installation of the new Chair, Nancy Ferguson.

The Support to Communities of Faith Commission will host the opening worship, while the Pastoral Relations Commission will host the closing worship. The decision was made to hold off on workshops, presentations, celebrations, retirements, church closures, etc. until the May 2024 in-person meeting. Susan is waiting for confirmation from St. Peter's UC in Sudbury to be the site for the installation of the Chair portion of the meeting.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Pastoral Relations Request

John shared that there is a request from the PRC re: ministers requesting financial support in our region. John proposed the creation of a benevolent fund for ministry personnel, to be administered by the Pastoral Relations Minister and the Chair of the Commission, funded at \$2,000 annually. The team agreed with Peter's suggestion that this fund could come from the existing special funds supporting ministers. Bill expressed concern about the limited amount, suggesting a higher funding of \$5,000 would be more reasonable and the Pastoral Relations Commission will set up the criteria for the fund.

# Appendix A Executive Minister Report October 2023

Happy Fall!!! I am grateful to return from sick leave and continue to recover. I am currently on graduated return to work and hope to return full-time by the end of October. I deeply appreciate the time the United Church provided for recovery and in particular the support of Jody and Susan Whitehead, along with the entire staff of CSRC and SWRC who provided key support in my absence. I am grateful to be back.

The Joint Regional Councils Executives Ad Hoc Committee for the CSRC and SWRC met on May 2, 2023. The group included Chair Barb and President David and Chair-Elect Nancy and President-Elect Tina. The conversation focused on our relationship between Regional Councils, planning between Regional Councils and a discussion about the 2025 Festival of Faith event. A gathering of both Executives was planned for fall 2023, but needed to be postponed and we will need to discuss rescheduling.

### Festival of Faith 2023 and 2025:

The 2023 Festival of Faith went well and I am grateful for the hard work of both volunteers and staff who supported the event. In particular, I am grateful to Rev. Rob Smith who planted the seed for the festival of faith initially! We gained many learnings from our first gathering and participants shared they were grateful to gather together to worship, laugh, learn and grow in faith. One key concern was the size of the facility and mobility issues.

### **Jeffery Dale:**


We said goodbye to Jeffery Dale who accepted a Call to Port Elgin United Church. I want to express deep appreciation for Jeffery's ministry within Shining Waters Regional Council and Canadian Shield Regional Council. In my absence, Diane and Jody have been working towards replacing Jeffery's position who will provide key leadership support around Youth Ministry and Faith Formation in CSRC and Justice ministry, Youth Leadership and Faith Formation in SWRC.

#### Staff lead, CSRC:

As part of our transition to a more integrated staff, I have asked Diane Matheson-Jimenez to enter the role of Staff Lead for the Canadian Shield Regional Council. This would be a similar role to Jody Maltby in Shining Waters Regional Council. The Staff Lead role partners with the Executive Minister around coordination, partnership and key leadership. In particular, Diane will focus on coordinating administrative staff, especially at events like the Regional Meeting and the Festival of Faith. Diane would also be in the position to provide key leadership in my absence.

**Pastoral Relations Minister:** Currently Dale Hildebrand has indicated that he will be retiring by the end of 2023. Dale serves as Pastoral Relations Minister for Shining Waters Regional Council. As part of our staff partnership with Shining Waters Regional Council, Rob Smith will begin to more formally partner with Shining Waters Regional Council focusing on Pastoral Relations work, in partnership with Todd Smith and Eun-Joo Park. Rob will continue to serve as CSRC Pastoral Relations minister.

**Melody Duncanson-Hales:** Melody continues to serve CSRC as Congregational Support Minister part-time and also supports the CSRC and SWRC part-time through the General Council Philanthropy Unit. This summer, at the request of the Philanthropy Unit, Melody's role shifted from 60/40 in CS&SW/General Council Office to 50/50 CS&SW/GCO. The shift reflects a shift in work within both CSRC and SWRC with greater demand for her work around stewardship development in both Regional Councils. GCO requested the financial shift to reflect the practical shift in work supporting congregations through stewardship support.

Peter opened the meeting with a prayer and highlighted Helen Smith today, as she has a particularly difficult and challenging funeral in Sault Ste. Marie today.

#### **CORRESPONDENCE**

- Email from Fraser Williamson re: 2024 RCM Date Executive discussed the letter from Fraser Williamson regarding the date of the 2024 Regional Council Meeting (RCM). This issue was referred to the Pastoral Relations Commission (PRC) at the October 2023 CSRC Executive meeting. The PRC have since met and made the decision that there will not be an ordination at the 2024 RCM in Sault Ste. Marie. Executive directed Peter to write a joint response letter to Fraser Williamson on behalf of himself, the Executive Minister, the Chair of Executive, the Chair of the PRC, and the Chair of the Nominations Committee. See section "Possible 2024 Ordination – Update from PRC" below for more information.
- Email from Melody Duncanson Hales re: funding
   The team also discussed responding to a funding request from Melody regarding Reseau
   Access and support for a supervised consumption site (petition signing initiative). A decision
   was made to have Dave draft a letter to Melody from Barb and the Support to Communities
   of Faith Commission. Kathie requested the letter include a call for other communities of faith
   to show public support.

#### RESCHEDULING OF JOINT EXECUTIVE MEETING

Barb shared that the new Joint Executives meeting date will be on Tuesday, September 24 – Thursday, September 26, 2024 at Villa Loyola in Sudbury. Peter has already offered these dates to the SWRC Executive at their last meeting and the CSRC Executive has confirmed these new dates work.

There was consensus that the CSRC Executive will join the SWRC Executive in Sudbury, ON at Villa Loyola on September 24-26, 2024 for the Joint Executives Meeting.

#### POSSIBLE 2024 ORDINATION – UPDATE FROM PRC

Executive continued their discussion about the possibility of having an Ordination at the 2024 CS RCM. The PRC referred the matter back to Executive, indicating there are two are options available:

- 1. To wait to be ordained until the next RCM (2025), which will be online; or,
- 2. To be ordained at a different service (outside the in-person 2024 RCM) that they arrange with the Region.

Individuals seeking ordination would normally have to wait until the next meeting if their documents (Testamur) and Supervised Ministry Education (SME) were not in place. Alternatively, they could arrange a service at a location of their choice. The point was made that since all students must receive their Testamur and complete their SME before they can be ordained, it is clear the date of the RCM will not work. Executive discussed the implications of changing the date of the RCM at this time, i.e. losing the deposit for the venue, possibly not being able to book the venue again at this late date, possibly not being able to get the Moderator to attend the RCM, Nominations timeline changes, etc. A suggestion was made that there not be a formal ordination for the candidate but that an affirmation of ordination could happen at the meeting 2024 RCM in Sault Ste. Marie to recognize them.

#### **REGIONAL MEETING 2023 UPDATE**

Updates

As previously mentioned, the theme is called "The Stones Will Shout." Executive reviewed the agenda for the meeting and Barb shared that the SCoFC and the PRC will be leading the opening and closing worship, respectively. The agenda includes an optional refresher on Zoom protocols, a gathering and welcoming, and a time of grounding with the Right Relations Resource Team prior to the Remit vote. The team also planned to have a budget presented and voted on, nominations opened, and a new chair installed. The team also discussed the importance of registration deadlines and communication about the meeting, which had been taken over by Donna for website communications.

#### 2025 CS RCM

There was a brief discussion about the 2024 RCM and a possible lay-led congregation information session prior to the meeting in 2024, potentially inviting the Moderator to participate. John shared that several people expressed that we reconsider having the Ministry Personnel Retreats prior to the RCM, as many people who participate in those are part of the planning and want it to happen after the RCM.

Executive Accountability Report Starting Point
 Peter thanked the staff team and the Chair for planning the RCM in his absence and shared a draft of the Executive Accountability Report for the Report Packet at the upcoming RCM. Peter requested that Executive review the report and that any updates be sent to himself and Susan this week and emphasized that the report was a team effort.

#### **BUDGET UPDATE - 2024 CSRC DRAFT BUDGET**

Executive discussed the draft budget for 2024 and Peter shared that there is no requirement that Executive approves a budget before a RCM. He asked if Executive would like to conduct an evote to bring the draft budget to the RCM or just bring the draft budget to the RCM and then approve the final budget at the December meeting of Executive. Members decided to review it before presenting it at the regional meeting. They agreed that any major changes could be made at the December Executive meeting.

There was consensus that Executive will review the draft Budget prior to the 2023 CS RCM via email, with the Executive Minister drafting an email to the Financial Administrator, Janet MacDonald, asking to have it ready before the November 25, 2023 CS RCM.

#### **EXECUTIVE MINISTER'S REPORT**

Executive received the Executive Minister Report, for information (*attached as Appendix A*). Peter reported that Jeffrey's position is now vacant and the position of Justice and Faith Formation is about to be posted and there is a desire to re-establish youth ministry support for Canadian Shield.

Huntington University Update
 Peter has attempted on several occa sions to plan a meeting with the President of
 Huntington with no success with finding a mutual meeting time. He will continue to try to
 set up a meeting. If a meeting date is not chosen before the installation of Nancy as the
 new Chair for the CSRC, Executive can choose to pivot and have Nancy take over the
 negotiations if that is ideal.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Barbara shared her experience from the GC44 annual meeting, noting that the discussion about Designated Lay Minister (DLM) discussion took up a significant portion of the meeting time. Peter added that while the DLM conversation was complex, with some progress had been made, discussing their role in the church and their acceptance within communities of faith was also discussed. Bill, who co-authored the One Ministry report years ago, expressed his interest in understanding the current status of the issue. Peter indicated he would send Bill a link to the recorded conversation for better understanding. They also discussed the end of missionary work in South Korea.

# Appendix A Executive Minister Report November 2023

Happy Fall!!! I am grateful to return from sick leave and continue to recover. I am currently on graduated return to work and hope to return full-time starting in November. I deeply appreciate the time the United Church provided for recovery and in particular, the support of Jody Maltby and Susan Whitehead, along with the entire staff of CSRC and SWRC who provided key support in my absence. I am grateful to be back.

#### The Ad Hoc Committee:

The Ad Hoc Committee of the Canadian Shield Regional Council and Shining Waters Regional Council met May 2, 2023. The group included Chair Barb and David and Chair Elect Nancy and Tina. The conversation focused on our relationship between Regional Councils, planning between Regional Councils and a discussion about the 2025 Festival of Faith. A gathering of both Executives was planned for fall 2023, but needed to be postponed and Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive has proposed a new tentative date for fall 2024.

#### **Huntington University:**

Work continues updating the bi-laws for Huntington University, following the reorganization of The United Church of Canada and the establishment of Regional Councils. Nicole Treksler, legal council for The United Church of Canada, has forwarded first draft of proposed changes to the by-laws, which reflect the UCC structural shift. Chair Barb Nott and I have also reached out to Dr. Kevin McCormick, President and Vice-Chancellor of Huntington University, to discuss the proposed changes. We are currently waiting for a response.

#### Festival of Faith 2025:

The Festival of Faith in 2025 is planned for June 13-15, 2025. Currently, the Nominations Committees has asked for expressions of interest from both Regional Councils and we are focusing on Sudbury as the venue location. The Moderator will attend the Festival of Faith 2025! Rob Smith will provide key leadership for this event.

#### **Upcoming Moderator's Fourish Visit Update/change:**

In early 2023, the Moderator reached out to Regional Councils with the desire to host local Regional Flourish events across The United Church of Canada (hosted by the Moderator and coordinated and organized by the Moderators Office). The Moderator asked for May 1- 4, 2024. Our Regional Council Executive, sensitive to the significant geography, cost and environmental footprint of gathering folks from across the Regional Council, elected to attach our Regional Council Meeting (RCM) to the Flourish event hosted by our Moderator. The Executive also invited the Moderator to stay for our RCM and the Moderator offered to preach on Sunday May 5, 2024, concluding the Regional meeting. Recently the Moderator indicated that she needed to cancel a portion of her Flourish event and will focus on our Regional meeting May 3-5<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

#### 2023 Regional Meeting November

Planning for the meeting continues and I deeply appreciate Barb, Diane and Susan, who coordinated planning in my absence.

**Budget:** Janet continues planning for the 2024 Draft Budget and planning for the online Regional meeting continues.

#### **Strategic Plan Update**

Work continues around The United Church of Canada Strategic Plan. Key pieces for the Regional Council include the hiring of a national coordinator, Cameron Fraser (he/him) Director of Growth and Ministry Development. Cam, along with local CSRC and SWRC folks, partnered around hiring a local Growth Animator to be shared between the Canadian Shield Regional Council and Shining Waters Regional Council. Calin Lau was hired recently and will start January 1, 2024 for CSRC and SWRC.

The Growth initiative represents the leading priority of the Strategic Plan of The United Church of Canada. As a way to embody this priority, the General Council Office's Organizational Development and Strategy Unit is working with regional councils to create and fill six new positions. The six Growth Animators will be deployed across the regions to work in local and regional partnerships with a focus on renewing existing communities of faith, creating new communities, and strengthening invitation. Growth Animators will support and connect with communities where growth is occurring and seek to bring best practices and fresh possibilities where growth is a challenge and feels impossible.

The Growth initiative is seeking to articulate a vision for what growth and invitation looks like rooted in humility and respect as we together answer our call to be the church, become beloved community, and embody Deep Spirituality, Bold Discipleship, and Daring Justice. These staff will join a team that includes existing EDGE colleagues bringing their experience and expertise.

# MINUTES OF THE REGIONAL MEETING November 25, 2023

The Regional Council Meeting of the Canadian Shield Regional Council took place on November 25, 2023 via Zoom video conference. The theme was *The Stones Will Shout*.

#### FRIDAY, May 25, 2023

#### Words of Welcome, Opening of Meeting and Constituting the Council

The Canadian Shield Regional Council gathered via Zoom video conference at 12:30 p.m. to begin the Regional Council Meeting of the Canadian Shield Regional Council. Barbara Nott, Chair, welcomed all those participating, introduced herself and the Executive Minister, Peter Hartmans.

Chair Barbara Nott constituted the meeting in the name of Jesus Christ, and as the United Church gathered together, to deal with such business as should properly come before the Council.

Barbara gave an acknowledgement of the land and a safe space statement.

#### Introductions

The Chair made a number of introductions, including the online and technical hosts, the chaplain, the parliamentarian, the equity host, and the scrutineers. Peter Hartmans introduced the Canadian Shield Regional Council staff team and Barbara introduced the Canadian Shield Regional Council Executive.

Barbara Nott led the participants through a test motion and vote.

#### Opening motions

    - -lay members elected by the Community of Faith, respecting the balance of lay and ministry personnel where possible (Basis of Union 6.2.3);
    - -additional lay members as determined by the regional council if necessary, to respect a balance of ministry personal and lay members who are not ministry personnel in the membership of the Regional Council (2023 Manual C.1.2.b)
- b) Bounds of the Regional Council Meeting: that the bounds of the Regional Council meeting for voting purposes shall be the Zoom meeting ID 835 4652 3743 and when in session.
- c) Agenda: that the Agenda as printed and circulated be the order of business, subject

to those changes that are recommended by the Agenda & Business Chairperson and approved by the Regional Council; or as recommended by the Regional Council itself.

- d) Minutes: that the Minutes of the meetings of the Canadian Shield Regional Council held September 23-25, 2022 be approved as circulated.
- e) Accountability Reports: that the reports as presented in the Report Packet be accepted for information.
- f) Adjournment of Sessions: that the Chair has the authority to recess the Regional Council when business, as ordered, is completed.
- g) Corresponding Members: that corresponding members shall be: official guests of the Regional Council. Their names shall be included in the Record of Proceedings. (2023 Manual C.1.5)
- h) New Business: that any items of New Business shall be referred to Barb Nott, of the Agenda & Business Committee. New Business items close at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 25, 2023.

#### **Procedural Motions**

- 1. The procedural and prayer microphone shall be the chat box;
- 2. Any handouts must be authorized by the Agenda & Business Committee;
- 3. The Parliamentarian shall be Bill Steadman;
- 4. The Chair shall present a Proposal. The Chair will invite prayerful discernment and discussion on the wisdom of the Proposal. When the Chair discerns that the sense of the meeting is such that we are ready to hear a motion on the Proposal she/he will invite the presenter to put the motion. Once the motion has been moved and seconded, Rules of Debate and Order shall be followed;
- 5. At the discretion of the Chair, microphone time for each speaker will be limited to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  minutes per Proposal and  $1\frac{1}{2}$  minutes per motion with the exception of the mover (who may speak at the beginning and end of a motion).
- 6. Microphone time may be reduced at the discretion of the Agenda & Business Committee in 30-second increments when any item of business exceeds 20 minutes.
- 7. The normal voting procedure shall be a show of hands using the RAISE HAND function or \*9 for those on the phone. If two people are joined from the same household one person will vote with the Raise Hand function and the second will type YES or NO in the chat. Those who wish to abstain will type ABSTAIN in the chat. Where a secret ballot is required, an online poll will be provided.
- 8. In the case of limited time for business, items will be dealt with in the following order: Proposals to General Council, Proposals to Regional Council, Elections.

#### **Background for Consent Motions**

Evaluation and experience have shown that the agendas of meetings of the Executive are full and that time for fulsome discernment and discussion of important items is occasionally lacking.

A consent agenda is a tool to help the Regional Council focus on what is most important. Proposals which are routine or non-controversial actions or routine changes in policy or

procedure are included in the consent agenda. At the meeting, any 5 voting members of the Regional Council may request to move any item(s) from the consent agenda to be placed on the meeting's agenda. By courtesy, advance notice would be given to the Executive Minister. If you have a concern, you are encouraged to contact the Executive Minister in advance as an exchange of information may resolve a question.

In a consent agenda you may also find minutes of previous meetings, accountability reports, etc. The list of correspondence to the Executive (if any) is included with the reports to be received for information.

**Process for Removal of an Item from the Consent Motion:** 

The process for acting on the consent agenda in the opening sessions will be as follows:

- 1. Presider/chair: "You have all received the Report Packet, with the consent agenda. Do any 5 voting members wish to remove an item from the consent agenda to be placed on the meeting's agenda by the Business Table?"
- 2. If any 5 voting members requests it, an item is removed (by courtesy, advance notice would be given to the Executive Minister).

Presider/chair: "Without discussion, then, the consent agenda is ready for a vote. Those in favour? Opposed? All items on the consent agenda are adopted."

Procedural CARRIED

Diane Matheson-Jimenez gave an orientation to how the group will be together during the meeting, and a BRAVE slide was shared.

#### Opening Worship

A time of worship was led by the Support to Communities of Faith Commission.

#### Right Relations Resource Team "Grounding Time"

Whitney Bruno, a team member from the Right Relations Resource Team, led the Region in a time of grounding before the remit discussion and vote.

#### Remit Discussion and Vote

Whitney Bruno, a member of the Right Relations Resource Team, led the region in a grounding time and shared a video from the UC National Spiritual Gathering in July 2023. Melody Duncanson Hales let the region in a question and answer period and then offered a prayer before the remit vote.

- 1. That the United Church of Canada will be organized as follows: (1) a three-council structure, consisting of communities of faith, regional councils and a Denominational Council\*; and (2) an autonomous National Indigenous Organization; and,
- 2. That once the new autonomous National Indigenous Organization is established

within The United Church of Canada, it will have its own mechanisms to make any future changes to its structure and processes, and therefore, will not be subject to the remit process under section 7.4.1 of the Basis of Union\*\*; and,

- 3. The changes required for the establishment of the autonomous National Indigenous Organization.
- \* The "Denominational Council" and the "General Council" are often used interchangeably.
- \*\* The detailed proposed changes to the Basis of Union are listed in a chart on page 5 of this document (Remit 1: Study Guide for Category 3 Remit Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization), under the section heading "Frequently Asked Questions".



new and creative ways. Volunteers, music leaders, ministry personnel, camp staff, outreach staff, and congregational support staff have all worked tirelessly within our Regional Council and are deeply appreciated.

As a Regional Council, the region has hosted zoom gatherings for both Lay and Ministry Personnel and for support, updates and education. Our website/newsletter continues to be a key tool for communication within our Regional Council. Many local and a few regional networks and local groups have also met to connect, learn, challenge, listen, and work together. The Executive also celebrates the significant work of the Regional Council Commissions, networks/clusters, and information gatherings.

Through both Commissions, the Executive and various groups, we have hosted a number of Town Hall meetings, network gatherings (MILC for example in Sudbury among many), local gatherings organized by neighbouring communities of faith across the Regional Council. We have also partnered with Shining Waters Regional Council around a number of events, including inviting Shining Waters Regional Council folks to gather with the Canadian Shield Regional Council at the Festival of Faith in North Bay this past June. It was a delight to gather with folks from both Regional Councils and the Executive is so very grateful for the 2023 Festival of Faith Planning Team. We are planning a more formal joint Festival of Faith in 2025 in Sudbury, hosted by both the Canadian Shield Regional Council and Shining Waters Regional Council.

#### Work of the Regional Executive

Our Executive meets monthly (with the exception of the summer) and does the work of the Regional Council when our region is not meeting (C.3.1.1). Often the Executive has a very full agenda which includes oversight of the regional commissions, regional finances, regional policy, regional meeting, emerging work, and the Executive Minister and staff.

The draft 2024 budget will be presented at our regional council meeting. This past year's spending reflects an unusual year returning to a new normal following Covid 19 shift.

#### Monthly Work of the Regional Council Executive

#### Working towards Right Relations, Anti-Racism and Equity

The Regional Council also lifts up our commitment to equity across our work and living into Right Relations. The Right Relations Resource Team provide key leadership within the Regional Council and have an updated information section on our regional website. <a href="https://canadianshieldrc.ca/justice-issues/right-relations/">https://canadianshieldrc.ca/justice-issues/right-relations/</a>

The United Church of Canada is working towards becoming an anti-racist institution. For the United Church, it means encouraging the General Council Office, Regional Council Offices, communities of faith, and even Canadian society, to pause and reflect. The United Church has allocated staffing and resources for both General Council staff, regional staff and Ministry Personnel. The United Church is offering training, learning opportunities and discussion groups as part of a strategy of becoming an anti-racist Church. Practically, the Canadian Shield Regional Council and Shining Waters Regional Council staff have joined together on a one-year journey of reflecting, learning, re-learning history, theological reflection, and discussion on how to become an anti-racist Church and work towards right relationship. Staff from both regions met together bi-weekly to talk, learn, challenge, pray, reflect, and discuss on a path toward becoming an anti-racist church.

Both Regional Councils have encouraged equity conversations at the Executive level, as well as commission and committee levels of the church.

As part of our work around living into Right Relations as the United Church of Canada the United Church of Canada is asking Regional Councils and Pastoral Charge boards to

vote on Remit 1 by March 31, 2024 and return the voting results to General Council by March 31.

# Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization (Deadline March 31, 2023.

This is a Category 3 Remit, and so requires a vote by every regional council and each pastoral charge's governing body. If a regional council or a pastoral charge does not register a vote, that is considered a vote against the proposal (A no vote, so please vote).

There is one question to be voted on, as follows:

Does the regional council/pastoral charge agree to amend the Basis of Union to reflect:

That The United Church of Canada will be organized as follows: (1) a three-council structure, consisting of communities of faith, regional councils and a Denominational Council\*; and (2) an autonomous National Indigenous Organization; and

That once the new autonomous National Indigenous Organization is established within The United Church of Canada, it will have its own mechanisms to make any future changes to its structure and processes, and, therefore will not be subject to the remit process under section 7.4.1 of the Basis of Union\*\*; and

The changes required for the establishment of the autonomous National Indigenous Organization.

Rachael Howes, administrator for both Regional Councils, transitioned into retirement at the end of May 2023. We are grateful for her many years of service. As a result of Rachael's retirement, Susan Whitehead transitioned to primary administrative support to Peter Hartmans for both Regional Councils in the spring of 2023. Donna Rutz transitioned to communication support for both Regional Councils, including website management in 2023. We added Celio de

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Andrade Santos Jr., to increase our administrative support to program staff in CSRC and in 2023, in anticipation of Rachael's retirement, we hired Kathleen Wolfe for administrative support. Celio and Kathleen both provide administrative support for both Regional Councils.

Dale Hildebrand, SWRC pastoral Relations minister, transitions to retirement in early 2024. He works for Shining Waters Regional Council but has supported the Canadian Shield Regional Council on various occasions in Rob's absence.

Jeffery Dale, who supported Justice/Youth Ministry and formation for ministry for both CSRC and SWRC, transitioned to parish ministry in the fall of 2023. Jeffery was called to Port Elgin United Church in the fall of 2023. Currently we are working quickly to find a replacement for Jeffery's position and we will be providing updates in the near future.

I have deeply appreciated the work of Jeffery Dale, Susie and Rachael within the Regional Council and they will be missed.

#### Strategic Plan:

2023 marks the start of the implementation of The United Church of Canada Strategic Plan (2023-2025). Sharing the introduction of the strategic plan it states:

"In partnership with regions and the Indigenous Church, the national ministry will dedicate focus, energy, and resources to revitalizing the church towards a vibrant future. We will renew by strengthening existing communities of faith towards transformation. We will create by encouraging the development and sustainability of 100 new communities of faith, with a particular focus on churches that serve migrant communities. And we will invite by investing in sharing our unique witness with neighbours across the country and encouraging participation in our ministries, communities, and campaigns. This passion for growth will be enabled by leadership development, supported by denomination wide strengths, fostered by justice campaigns and climate initiatives, and realized alongside Indigenous pathways.

Our priority plan pulls key activities in each of these strategic objectives into service towards dynamic growth.

Daring Justice. This is our Call, grounded in our statements of faith, right relations commitment, and core values, but articulated anew for this time. Along with our Call is a Vision to become "a bold, connected, and evolving church" as disciples of Jesus in this place." Recently, the General Council office, in consultation with the Regional Council, will hire 6 Growth Animators, which are full time positions, to support the work of growth and renewal for the UCC. Rev Calin Lau was hired by General Council to serve as Growth Animator for the Canadian Shield Regional Council and Shining Waters Regional Council starting January 1, 2024!

Nominations put out 2 calls for Expressions of Interest in late summer:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Membership on the planning team for the Festival of Faith 2025 this a joint venture between CSRC and the Shining Waters RC and will be held in Sudbury. Membership is almost complete.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Membership on the planning team for the in-person Regional Council Meeting (RCM) happening on May 3-5, 2024 in Sault Ste. Marie. Planning will start shortly after the November 25, 2023, online meeting.

As we move towards our in-person RCM in 2024, the committee has asked the commissions and the resource teams to review their membership needs as part of the nomination push for the RCM.


The Nominations Committee looks forward to putting out the call for disciples, to receiving your nominations and to gather in-person as a Regional Council in May 2024.
